and all sorts of futurologists in the informal non-technological sector are working over to provide people with cautions and predictions. The palmists, the astrologers and other celestial observers are right up there in the totem pole and in between there are occupants who try a variety of channels to obtain information on things which have not happened yet. Mirrors are subjected to deep stares, entrails are sometimes examined and pots of water are rolled into the ground to see which way things plan to move. They are the poor cousins in the divining trade but the bird men are the pits. Just about the only ones who go to the birds, are those who are so badly off and down in luck that they have no zone to turn, except run down parrots, managed by equally run down handlers. Fortunately for all, the number of such decrepits are not few in luck in Bangladesh.

It wasn't easy trying to get in touch with the pavement prophets, because such oracles are patronised by those who literally move more comfortably in the streets, than they do in rooms and chambers. Even the appropriately dark and dank rooms which the horoscope crowd prefer hoping it adds something to the atmosphere is far too mystic for the poor and nearly wretched men who squat in front of the man, his row of dirty envelopes and the bird nonchalantly walking across and picking one at

stop at Asad Gate. For reasons of trade and credibility, Habibullah claimed that he is rarely wrong or his bird is rarely so. The parrot not exactly born with gifts of prophecy, can be trained very quickly we were told. Didn't it make the entire business of telling the future a matter of chance? was a question which came very easily. The answer was that, a trained bird rarely made a mistake in foretelling what was about to come.

Habibullah did not seem very keen to inform about his income etc. Upon great insistent he said that he had put in over five years and he has not become rich doing this. He used to be an assistant in a cloth shop in Patuatully, but there was theft there and he decided that as a poor man, he could always be a suspect. He felt too insecure and took to the road. And he came to the future reading trade through a person who shared his board and came from his same hometown Narsingdi.

An old man paid Taka one and had his envelope picked. He read it with an unmoving face without betraying joy or pain. It obviously didn't end his problems. Habib, reading my thoughts, asked me to pick one. My envelope read, "Although you have far to go there are dangers. Be careful when buying property." It seemed reasonably vague to qualify as a prediction. A pinched face Habib informed, that bad news is not good business. Location is also very important. Anybody who can get a spot near an office or embassy can make money. But he himself is not that lucky.

# A genius, a Lordship Murshed by name


Today is the 12th death anniversary of the late Chief Justice Syed Mahbub Murshed who made his mark not only as a jurist but also as a patriot, committed to the welfare of people of Bangladesh. The tribute to the late Justice Murshed, made available to The Daily Star by family friends, was written by the late Nurul Momen, a former professor of Law of Dhaka University and a well-known playwright and a personal friend of the former Chief Justice. Momen passed away last year.

If to be a genius, a person has to have exalted intellectual power; instinctive, extraordinary, creative, and imaginative faculty late Chief Justice Syed Mahbub Murshed was undoubtedly

Again if lordship means, in the dictionary sense, to have a lord's personality, then Murshed was undoubtedly one for the fact that his qualities of head and heart were such as to make the people around him as a person towering far above

It is said nothing succeeds like success about a man when he is considered most successful in his life. That means when a man is as successful as he ever was expected to be all adverse speculations about him are set at rest, as nobody having any practical sense dares to comment, in any prejudicial manner, upon his success which is taken for granted. And more so after his death as success stays finally at the height he achieves at his death and there remains nothing to detract from it after his death.

The success Chief Justice Murshed achieved during his life, scintillated till the time of his death. Therefore, it is no wonder that people now find such unsurpassing qualities in him, like they do in the retrospective in all such successful persons, after great success they achieve. It may be said in other worlds if Chief Justice Murshed were less successful, people who did not know him intimately would have regarded



him as possessing less of those qualities, which they found he was endowed with by the measure of the big success he had to his

any person, who knew him (Murshed) intimately when he was young could easily foretell this future for him to come, almost with the exactitude as it finally came. If he had achieved a success less than what he had, that person would have considered it was a sad deviation from the normal expectation of his achievement.


