The inaugural session of the fifth Jatiya Sangsad (parliament) begins today at 9 am amid high hopes among the people for shaping a democratic polity.

The new parliament, formed after a mass upsurge is expected to solve constitutional issues, and strengthen democratic institutions destroyed in nine years of autocratic rule.

It is the first parliament in independent Bangladesh which represents all shades of opinion. Its election has been recognized as free and fair. None boycotted the election.

The government Thursday decided to waive tax on holdings upto 25 bighas of land from Pahela Baishakh (April 15) next and raise the age limit for entering into government jobs from 27 to 30. reports BSS.
