CMM's statements corroborated by witnesses

The arms case trial of deposed President H M Ershad resumed yesterday with the cross examination of two more prosecution witnesses.

The witnesses corroborated the statements made earlier before the Tribunal by the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate

Ershad was put in the dock of the Special Tribunal at around 10:30 a.m. looking as grim and gloomy as he did at the previous hearing on Sunday. And though he had recovered from a fever he looked very depressed.

The prosecution witnesses cross examined Tuesday were Dental Surgeon Ishtiaque Ahmed and the Executive Engineer of the Public Works Department A. K. M. Mukitur

Syed Ishtiaque Ahmed was a signatory to the seizure list prepared by the ASP of the CID Golam Mostafa, who seized a lot of documents found in the Sena Bhaban by the Inventory Committee.

The CID officer seized the documents from the CMM on December 26.

Ishtiaque Ahmed said that the list of the items found in the Sena Bhaban by the Inventory Committee was prepared in front of him but that he did not see any of the recovered articles.

He said that one Anil Kumar Saha, known to the CMM, was also present during the preparation of the seizure list and was also one of its signatories. The other prosecution wit-

US, Israel agree on ME confce

JERUSALEM, Apr 9: The United States and Israel agreed in principle today to a regional Middle East peace conference being held but a host of practical details remained to be worked out, a senior US official said, reports Reuter.

The official briefed reporters after Secretary of State James Baker met separately the Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir, Foreign Minister David Levy. Defence Minister Moshe Arens and a delegation of six Palestinians from the occupied territories.

Earlier report said: Israel told the United States on Tuesday it was ready to hold peace talks with the Arabs under American auspices and with the Soviet Union's participation, reports AP.

US Secretary of State James A. Baker responded positively to the initiative presented to him by Foreign Minister David Levy, but said he wanted to speak with Arab leaders before committing the US govern-Arab agreement to the

Israeli initiative could mean a significant breakthrough, even though the outcome of any negotiations would be uncertain. "We have had a productive

and very constructive meeting," Baker said after the hourlong session with Levy at the foreign ministry.

Baker then met for 2 1-2 hours with Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir, who had set a positive tone for Baker's stop in Israel by announcing that about 1,000 Palestinian prisoners would be released this weekend.

Baker and Shamir said nothing afterward. But Avi Pazner, the Prime Minister's press councillor, said the two would meet again, either later Tuesday or Wednesday before Baker goes to Cairo.

"I think the fact that they are continuing to talk is a sign there is something to talk about," Pazner said.

Tuesday's declaration comes against a backdrop of fighting between ethnic Georgians and South Ossetians that has claimed more than 50 lives in recent months. South Ossetians, mostly

Muslims, want to be an autonomous republic loyal to the Kremlin; the mainly Christian Georgians want to leave the Soviet Union. Georgia was one of five reand the three Baltic republics, that refused to take part in a nationwide referendum on preserving the union. The Baltics also are seeking independence from the union. Nine republics, represent-

ing three-quarters of the country's population, approved the march 17 referendum by 76 per cent. Gorbachev has used the results to bolster support for his proposal to strengthen and revamp the Union Treaty governing relations among the 15 Soviet Republics.

Meanwhile workers at 17 factories and enterprises in the Byelorussian capital of Minsk called for a three-hour warning strike Tuesday despite economic concessions by the republic's government.

The call puts more pressure on Gorbachev, already facing a six-week-old nationwide strike by coal miners who insist on his resignation. Gorbachev has steadfastly refused to step down.

Gorbachev Tuesday declared that the crisis facing his country has reached "alarming"
