MCC to test two-faced bat

LONDON, Apr 11: The Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC), custodian of the games' rules and traditions, has decided to test a controversial new double-sided bat, reports Reuter.

The bat which has a twofaced blade designed to last twice as long as an ordinary bat, has angered many cricket purists, including the MCC, since its launch last month. But Lt-Colonal John

Stephenson, MCC secretary, has written to the manufacturers to say: "I do appreciate that your double-faced bat complies with the laws of cricket.

"I would appreciate it if you could let the MCC cricket subcommittee have sight of one of your bats simply so that MCC, as custodians of the laws, have a chance to see what is being produced.

Under cricketing rules, bats should be wooden, no longer than 38 inches (97 cms) and no winder than 4-1/2 inches (11 cms).
