

. A decade back a colleague of mine talked of how he spent Tk. 300 on cards each Eid. I found the amount staggering at that time but today spending Tk 200 during every Eid season on cards is not all that shocking, specially if one goes in for foreign cards from India, and hand painted productions on canvas or muslin, done by the students of the Institute of Fine

It was not such a done thing to send cards ten to 20 years ago, apart from official exchange of polite notes and signatures on an official level. Yet today New Market and Stadium card shops and centres like "Jiras's Art Gallery", "Aarong" and "Shetuli", which specialise in greeting cards during Eid season are crowned with buyers. The customers are usually the younger generation, or parents who have children studying abroad. There is a fair exchange of Etd cards between Dhaka and the Middle East, apart from doting aunts and mothers sending the paper love tokens to USA, Europe or even Australia and Russia.

The young painters at the Institute of Arts and Crafts have found a good venue to gain some money and flaunt their art with the advent of Eid. They sometimes use even oil paints on paper. These have at times been stuck on paper and sold at high prices. "This is miniature art" a gallery owner offers his explanation for the high price of Tk 60 and

These exquisite and artistic productions, usually containing scenes of rural Bangladesh. though undoubtedly appealing to the eye, are expensive to post, specially if the destination is outside the Subcontinent. The rates for posting cards to India and Pakistan are still reasonable. The painted cards by students now use cloth instead of canvas, on most occasions, and fabric paints. They are to be found at New Market, Stadium and the Shahbagh "Jiras" Gallery.

The prices and qualities of the cards vary. The same pack of UNICEF cards is at least Tk 10 more at Sheraton and Sonargaon Hotel shops as in the "Kiosk" or "Champak". Similarly the cards at "Shetuli" at Sonargaon are more expensive than the ones we get at the Green Road "Shetuli". "We have our rents to cover". the shop girl explains.

You can get cards ranging from Tk 3 and Tk 4 - which you may be able to bargain and bring down, perhaps even lower if you are buying in large numbers, such as in the case of the Azad

and Ideal products - to imported Indian items. which may rocket up to Tk 40 or even Tk 50. This is so when the quality, size and pattern is unusual. The range moves from cheap local productions with gilt gold and silver tinsel decorations to the westernised creations from India. Thus you will get dogs, cats, cars and locomotive engines included for the western taste for the nephew born and brought up in Boston or London in the Indian Eid cards that a are sold at New Market.

"There is no smuggling or blackmarketing going on", comments a shopkeeper. "People coming from India bring in a handful." Whatever is the process of the entree of the interesting Indian items. I have seen the market flooded with them the whole year round, providing for every occasion ranging from Eid to Christmas, birthday to anniversary.

The taste for Eid cards with camels, crescent moon, garish roses and other gaudy illustrations are still very much there. These are locally produced, embellished with nettings and straw. But their prices are not astronomical. I am surprised that people still go in for them at the New Market stalls as now the middle class can afford the more sophisticated finish or take the easy way out with the UNICEF, or BRAC cards with the straw finish.

Apart from the printed and painted cards there are the ones with tye-and-dye and leather embellishments. There are the embroidered ones too. There are also the specially designed.

Eid cards by the artist Suriya, which the connoisseur will find, are at "Champak" at Sheraton.

Handmade cards range from Tk 15 to Tk 45. The batik is available for Tk. 15 while leather items on paper are Tk 30. The handstitched product is no less than Tk 35 while the fabric paint on muslin is for Tk 25. The screen prints are for Tk 10. Cards with photos taken from nature are for Tk 20. The net and straw garish extravaganzas are for Tk

Even if you should not possess enough to buy and post exotic Eid cards, Jiras's Art Gallery can provide you with a set of artistic postcards. prints of famous Bangladeshi paintings, while the National Museum has appropriate postcards for the season for Tk. 3 each. These contain Moghul motifs.
