
Earth Day today: heat wave sweeps country

The situation is so serious we may not have a planet if we don't take action," he said. The planet belongs to you and me and we have to take care of

Diane Mac Eachern, author of "Save Our Planet: 750 everyday ways you can help clean up the earth," also appeared on the world net program.

Mac Eachern emphasized the need for everyone to conserve energy and make use of renewable fuels. She also suggested that manufacturers be required to provide an environmental impact statement about the goods they produce.

Nelson suggested putting a tax on goods in accordance with the cost of disposing the waste associated with the product. He added that he believes the cost of gasoline to Americans should be boosted so as to force consumers to conserve energy and to spur development of alternative fuels and ways of using fuel more efficiently.

Speakers condemned the activities of a gang of terror ists led by black Faruk who has let loose a reign of terror in the locality under the committing crimes with impunity.


