

Potato sells below production cost

From A Correspondent April 23: Potato growers of the district have been de-

prived of fair price of their produce. The farmers have achieved a bumper production of potato this season. It is learnt from

source that 10,000 hectares of land have been brought under potato cultivation in the district. The target of production has exceeded.

Farmers are coming to hats, bazars and markets of the district with sacks full of potatoes. Due to abundant supply the prices have come down. Potatoes are being sold in the market below production cost at Tk. 4. The prices of onion, garlic and ginger are still high and sell at Taka 20, 40 and 30 respectively.

There is no cold storage at Meherpur or at Chuadanga, the neighbouring district. The hard laboured vegetables can fetch attractive price if storage facilities are made available.

Agro-economy of the district falls down to a minimum for want of cold storage facility.

Boro harvesting begins

April 23: The harvesting of boro paddy is going on in full swing throughout the district. About 1,32,923 hectares of

land have been brought under boro cultivation in 13 upazilas of the district during the current boro season. Over 3,30,501.81 metrictons o paddy are expected to be produced in the district this year but natural disasters like heavy rain with hail-stroms since March and pest menace in 13 upazilas of the district, have damaged about 40 per cent standing crops.

Consequently the production target of boro paddy may not be achieved this year.

24 examinees expelled

590 tubewells lying inoperative

April 23: About 590 shallow tubewells have been lying inoperative in six upazilas of the district causing acute scarcity of pure water and hampering irrigation facilities, reports

According to Public Health Engineering Department (PHE), of the total tubewells 97 are in Sadar, 82 including tow Tara deep set in Shatlakupa, 85 including 12 Tara deep set in Harinakunda, 174 including 45 Tara deep set in Kaliganj. 30 in Kotchandpur and 122 in

Moheshpur upaztlas. Mechanical troubles and missing of spare parts are learnt to be the main causes of the tubewells lying inoperative.

According to sources, a total of 12,342 tubewells including 482 Tara deep set were installed in the district. Similar number of tubewells are also installed in private sector most of which have already gone out of order.

An encouraging result has been achieved from the experimental cultivation of peanut on the charland of Meghna and Tatulia rivers and more farmers have become interested in cultivating peanut. A vast tract of fallow land have been brought under peanut cultiva-

Experts are of the opinion that charlands are suitable for the cultivation of peanut with low cost. During dry seasons. these charlands emerge on the bed of the rivers Meghna and Tatulia where peanut could be cultivated easily. Peanut is found most profitable in these areas. The main peanut cultivable areas are: Sharfession, Monpura, Daulatkhan and Borhan Uddin upazila, it is learnt.

Informed sources said peanut has now become a cash crop in this flood affected areas where production of paddy and other crops are completely uncertain. Many of the farmers are now engaged in



The labour laws also confirm the appointment of a labour welfare officer each tea garden. Mr. Imdad, a leader alleged

that James Finlay for 500 tea employees and 84 thousand tea labourers in 31 tea garden and 8 tea factories engaged only seven MBBS doctors with 27 dispensaries where medicine supply is very meagre. No welfare officer has yet been appointed in tea sector.

2 killed

The victim went out of the house on Thursday The causes behind both the murders could not be ascertained as yet. Two separate cases were registered with the respective police stations in this connection.
