KHULNA, Apr 30 : Diarrhoea claimed at least 53 lives during the last 28 days in greater Khulna, Bagerhat and Satkhira.

While more than 4,000 persons were attacked by the disease. Of the total 53, 18 died at the Khulna Hospital while 1,560 underwent treat-

At the same time, another 20 persons died in different upaztla health complexes of the district and 86 persons were treated at those hospi-

Deputy Director of Health, Khulna Division told The Daily Star a total of 1,124 persons were reported to be attacked in Bagerhat district of whom seven lives were claimed by the disease from April 7 to 24. He also told that 291 per-

sons were reported to be attacked and eight persons died in Satkhira district from April 11 to 23.

There was an information of nine deaths by the some disease at Tala Upazila. According to information, 500 patients of diarrhoea, were treated at Khulna Shishu Hospital while more than one thousand semi diarrhoeal patients were treated at the outdoor of the hospital during the last twenty eight days.
