the entire foot path is filled with different types of pots; then we find them at one side of Mohammedpur Bazaar, and on the other end to cater to the taste of the expatriates there is quite a big shop just outside Gulshan D.I.T. (2) market. And there are many more all round the city. Recently the various fairs in the city have more then one stall of these earthen pots, offering various ornamental shapes and sizes, but within a reasonable price range.

Today even the offices have pot plants to give it a touch of warmth and present a welcoming atmosphere. The plants that these earthen pots carry are sometimes the focal point of the room or balcony, whether in a house or in an office. It is an object that one is tempted to walk towards it and admire it more closely.

Every gardener can make good use of these pots. Ornamental or practical, they can play a fundamental role in the overall design of the house and add colour and variety all year


