



The Bogra area troops sent nine thousand more packets of dry food containing chira. gur, sugar and milk power to Chittagong by road for distribution to the distressed people.

A Landing Craft Tank (LCT) of the army in Dhaka is being loaded with relief materials including 20 thousand pieces of saree, 20 thousand pieces of clothes, 10 thousand pieces of old clothes, 1 thousand pieces of bankets, 500 pieces of tents, 100 pieces of furniture, 30 tons of chira, 10 tons of gur. 10 bales of markin cloth, 1000 pieces of water filter and 100 relief boxes. The vessel is expected to sail for Bhola tomorrow.

Other relief activities of Chittagong, Comfla and Jessore area troops are going on. Army Medical Teams working at different places are car rying on their medical assistance to the affected people. Army medical teams from the Jeesore area are also working at different remote islands on board trawlers, the press release said.

Meanwhile, army personnel carried out rescue operation at the tornado-affected village near Tongi.

They also served cooked food to the affected people at Patenga and Katighar in Chittagong.

Bangladesh Air Force despatched 47 tons of foodstuff, medicines and other relief materials to the cyclone affected offshore islands by transport aircrafts and helicopters.



# Islanders anxiously wait for succour

BARISAL, May 8: It was a fateful night for more than fifty lakh people of about 50 islands along the coast line in the southern region of the country.

The cyclone has hit the vast areas of about 15 districts including far-flung char and offshore islands. Within two to three hours the cyclonic storm washed away at least 30 offshore islands with its inhabitants, educational institutions. kutcha, semi-pucca dwellings, cattleheads and crops of thou

sands acres of land. According to an eye wit nesses a captain of a Chittagong bound vessel from Barisal, dead bodies of men and women with cattleheads are floating all together along the coast line of Sandwip. A stinky odour has engulfed the entire environment with the

fast flowing wind. The tidal surge washed away as many as 40 thousand people into the deep sea although many of them could come ashore in return tide

some hours back. Cyclone has also hit Monpura, an island 18 miles from mainland Bhola. More than 40 thousand people of this island experienced a horrifying nightmare during the time of cyclone disaster.

There were only seven cyclone shelters for men and six shelters for cattleheads in Monpura upazila. Those were very meagre for 40 thousand inhabitants of the upazila. As a

result, thousands of people had to face cyclonic catastrophe outside the shelters.

Now Monpura is being considered as one of the worst af fected upazila out of the 47 cyclone hit upazilas in southern region of the country.

It may be recalled here that this Monpura island was completely washed away with its all inhabitants, crops, cattleheads in the flood of 1970.

#### No food, no water

Char Nijam, a far-flung island of Monpura upazila is now seems to be an abandoned land. Some people are still living there having no food or

BHOLA. May 8: The colossal found to be broken and that about 10 thousand cattletwisted. These too very much inadequate to give shelter to thousands of people including children hit by the cyclone. Only 400 to 500 persons

can be accommodated in those cyclone shelters, while thousands remain outside the building under the open air to face the disaster.

However, five cyclone shelters were reported to have been built by the Red Crescent at different places of Bhola last year. But the construction of another 15 cyclone shelters to be built under the Japanese Red Cross aid came to a halt due to red tapism of Bangladesh Red Crescent Society, according to the unit chief of Bangladesh Red Crescent Society based at Char Fasson. He. however, hoped that with the damage of this year's cyclone at Bhola, the Red Crescent as well as the government may come up with massive construction of cy-

## Pucca bridge over Chitra demanded

MAGURA, May 8: Road communication between Salikha and Mohammadpur upazila headquarters is being hampered due to absence of a pucca bridge on river Chitra, reports UNB.

The distance between the two upazila headquarters is about 20 kilometres and they are connected by road only.

Salikha upazila parishad constructed a wooden bridge on the river Chitra two years back but it broke after a year.

Local people said prices of consumer goods shot up in markets as motorised vehicles carrying supplies stopped plying through the road.

Meanwhile, three women allegedly committed suicide in separate incidents during the last four days in the district.

According to police Ferdousi Begum (18), wife of Abbas Ali of village Abalpur under Sadar upazila allegedly committed suicide by taking poison recently.

Another Majeda Khatoon (20), wife of Saheb Ali village Raipur Kashidanga under Sadar upazila allegedly committed suicide by taking poison on the same day.

It is learnt from different sources that all the suicides were committed due to their family troubles. Bodie were sent to morgue for postmortem.

Separate cases were registered with Magura and Mohammadpur police stations in this connection.
