8,350 boats worth Tk 115 cr missing

About 8.350 boats with fishing materials worth an approximate sum of Taka 115 crore have been missing in the deep sea since the cyclonic storm and tidal surge on April 29, according to a preliminary report.

The Information Secretary while briefing the newsmen Dhaka Sunday evening said at least 59,000 people of the coastal districts have suffered losses in course of the catastrophic cyclone.

He said the missing boats include 6250 country boats worth Taka 24 crore and 2100 mechanised boats costing about Taka 91 crore.

The FAO is expected to support the rehabilitation of the small fishermen, he said.
