

# Defeated Bhattarai quits as PM

KATHMANDU, May 14: Prime Minister Krishna Prasad Bhattarai, who led the campaign that ended absolute monarchy last year, resigned Tuesday after being defeated in Nepal's first multiparty election in three decades, reports

Bhattarai lost his seat in his Kathmandu constituency to Madan Bhandari, a 39-year-old Marxist, by a slender margin of 751 votes out of 63,000 cast.

It is inappropriate for me to continue in government on political and moral grounds," said Bhattarai, 66, after submitting his resignation to the royal

"I accept the verdict of the people," he told reporters at

his home. King Birendra accepted Bhattarai's resignation.

Bhandari, a leftist activist who lived underground for 12 years until last year's revolution, received 27, 372 votes to Bhattarai's 26,621 in Kathmandu, according to final results.

"It is a vote for democracy. It is a vote for independence. leftist alliance 24.

It is a vote for the alleviation of poverty," said Bhandari, who was a candidate in two of Khatmandu's five districts and won in both.

Ten of thousands of jubilant supporters of Bhandari's United Communist Party. which dominates the leftist alliance, poured into the streets of Kathmandu hours after the result was declared, dancing. waving red flags and smearing red powder on the faces of

onlookers. "Long live Communist unity," the jubilant supporters

shouted. The leftist alliance and the Nepali Congress emerged as the strongest political forces in Sunday's balloting for the 205-member House of Representatives.

Early results gave Nepali Congress a slim lead nationwide but it was still too early to predict what party or coalition could form a governing major-Of 59 results declared by

# 7 Navy ships damaged, two completely

Seven ships of the Bangladesh Navy were damaged, two of them completely, in the century's severest cyclone that hit the country's coastal areas April 29.

The Navy also lost a large quantity of armaments, mostly those donated by foreign countries, in the tidal surge that accompanied the cyclone. One of the two completely

damaged ships, BNS Sanket was lost in the Bay. The other completely damaged ship is Shaheed Ruhul Amin, originally a Canadian ship that had arrived in Bangladesh in 1970 carrying relief goods. It was later handed over as a gift to the Bangladesh Navy.

The Bangladesh Navy used the Shaheed Ruhul Amin as a relief distribution ship.

The ship dashed against a merchant ship during the cyclone and as a result it breakup and sank in the river.

The BNS SR Amin also dashed BNS Sanket which instantly capsized and was lost.

According to Naval Head quarter sources the damage of the Naval ships was mainly due to other merchant ships being alongside them. During the cyclone two

ships - BNS Durjoy and BNS Durnibar capsized and still remain under water.

Naval forces are trying to salvage BNS Durjoy from the river Karnafuly.

Besides, BNS Nirbhoy and BNS Jamuna, two Navy ships, were also grounded during the tidal surge.

# UN appeal for help to cyclone victims

NEW YORK, May 14: The United Nations General Assembly on Monday called on all nations and humanitarian agencies to help the people of Bangladesh, stricken by a cyclone, tornados, floods and

disease, reports agencies. The non-binding resolution. passed unanimously, also appeals to international financial institutions "to respond urgently and generously to assist Bangladesh in its relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction efforts and programmes fol-

lowing the calamity." The General Assembly which was in special session took up the Bangladesh issue as special emergency matter, passing it by acclamation. The draft resolution was sponsored by Bangladesh.

Addressing the Assembly. Bangladesh Deputy Permanent Representative Mohiuddin Ahmed said the colossal human tragedy included 139,000 dead and many more homeless with around ten million people affected. Much of the country's infrastructure and crops have been destroyed, he said.

The estimated cost of relief and rehabilitation was 1.4 bil-

lion dollars, he said and appealed for more international assistance. Mohamed Essaafi, Coordina-

tor of the United Nations Disaster Relief Office (UNDRO). told a meeting of donor nations in Geneva he was heartened by international emergency aid made available to Bangladesh after the devastating cyclone.

"But massive external assistance is needed for the reconstruction and rehabilitation of Bangladesh," Essaafi, just back from a tour of the country, told diplomats and he UN's European headquarters in Geneva. Essaafi said a special UN Task Force was set up in Bangladesh to assess the extent of the overall damage. It would report to a special meeting due in July, chaired by France's Minister for Humanitarian Affairs Bernard
