# Development fund may be diverted to rehabilitation

The government may divert unutilised development funds to post-cyclone rehabilitation and reconstruction due to serious financial constraints, reports UNB.

Highly placed sources said Tuesday most external aid was now coming in urgent relief of cyclone victims, while government appeal for funds for reconstruction of important infrastructure had not yet got any concrete response.

Funding agencies including World Bank has reportedly accepted the government proposal for development fund diversion in view of huge money needed immediately for repair and reconstruction of some strategic installations and infrastructure.

Ways of diverting the funds from development projects are being discussed with World

Official sources said a 25 million US dollar IDA credit, approved for export development but remained unutilised for long, might be sperit for rehabilitation of Chittagong Port, battered by the April 29 catastrophic storm in country's coastline.

It was learnt that Japan was appealed on Monday for funds for reconstruction of Chittagong Port, but the response was negative.

Aid pledges, both in cash and kind, amounted to 245.33 million US dollars as of Tuesday cash component being only 26 million dollars.

Moreover, most of the total cash relief, about 22 million dollars, would be channeled to the eyelone victims through NGOs, as most donors prefer distribution of their relief through

Governmental Organisations. Cash assistance direct to the government is negligible. sources said, while it has to bear a huge cost of helicopter


