More organisations continue relief

Distribution of relief materials in cash and kind and donations to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund by various organisations and individuals continued Thursday.

BNP
BNP Standing Committee member and former Education Minister Prof Abdul Baten distributed Taka 10,000 and relief goods including 250 maunds of rice and 200 maunds of pulses to the cyclone-hit people of Gopabandha upazila of Patuakhali district. On his return to Dhaka the BNP leader issued a statement saying that houses, educational institutions and mosques in 20 unions of the two upazilas were badly damaged by the April 29 cyclonic storm and tidal surge. He estimated the loss at Taka 60 crore.

A meeting of the BNP Relief Committee Wednesday made a fervent call to the people of all spheres of life to donate to the PM's Relief Fund. Chaired by the committee chief Ni Chowdhury the meeting was attended by among others Asar Ahmed Siddiqui, AKM Firoz Noon, Mrs Tahmina Khan Oll, Ibrahim Rahman, Ali Akbar Babul, Saifullah Nazki, Advocate Jalal Chowdhury and Babul Chowdhury.

A BNP relief team led by Abdur Rab Chowdhury, MP left Dhaka for Noakhali Wednesday. The team carried huge relief materials.

Another BNP relief team led by the Law Minister Mirza Golam Hafiz Wednesday returned to Dhaka after distributing relief goods among the survivors of Anwara, Banskhali, Halishahar, Jalepara, Patenga and other parts of Chittagong division.

Sammilito Sanskritik Jote
Ten relief teams of Sannilito Sanskritik Jote are now working at the cyclone-battered areas of the country's southern and eastern regions. The teams carried dried food, ORS, medicine and other relief items worth about Taka 12 lakh.

UCB
Chairman of the Board of Directors of United Commercial Bank (UCB) Wednesday handed over a cheque of Taka 10,000 to the Prime Minister as UCB donation to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund. UCB Director Humayun Zahir and President and Marketing Director SA Shakoor were present.

Society for Rule of Law

Secretary General of the Society for Rule of Law Advocate Abdus Sobhan led a relief team distributing relief goods among the cyclone-affected people of Chittagong, Halishahar, Patenga, and Lalkhan Bazar. During his hectic tour at the area, Advocate Sobhan also made inquiries of relief needs. Returning from the area Wednesday, the society leader issued a press statement alleging that relief did not reach properly to the needy.

Railway scouts
A 20-member Railway Scouts Relief Team on Thursday distributed relief materials and life saving drugs among the cyclone affected people of different unions under Banskhali upazila.

Besides railway scouts, two railway doctors also worked with the team as volunteers. They distributed dry food, new and old clothings, candles, match boxes, water purifying tablets and oral saline in the remote areas by waking from door to door.

Apart from railway scout's own collection, women's front of Dhaka Railway Officers' Club is providing necessary relief materials to the scouts relief team.

More than 7 Section of RDR manpower and 15 medical teams are rendering round the clock service to the victims at Moheshkhali and Cox's Bazar sadar upazilas.

SEBA
Society for Economic and Basic Advancement (SEBA), a non-government development agency, started relief activities among the cyclone victims at sadar and Sonagazi upazila of Feni district and Mirsarai upazila of Chittagong district.

SEBA initially allotted Taka sixty six lakh for this programme while 9 volunteer teams are working at the affected areas to implement the relief programme successfully.

Among the goods distributed are flattened rice, molasses rice, pulse, potato, sweet pumpkin, onion, sayabean oil, salt, kerosene, fire wood, cloth, medicine, ORS, water purifying tablet, tent, cash support etc.

American Express

American Express company on Thursday announced a US \$ 1,00,000 programme assistance to cyclone victims for immediate and long-term relief efforts. The grant will be disbursed through the Prime Minister's Relief Fund. The International Child Health Foundation (ICHF), the International Red Cross and other NGOs which have launched cyclone rehabilitation projects.

The grant has been made by the American Express Philanthropic Program and American Express Bank Ltd. The grant to ICHF will be administered by its International Centre for Diarrhoeal Disease Research, Bangladesh (ICDDR,B). This specialized centre is dedicated to medical services in the field of potentially fatal diarrhoeal disease—the major medical problem resulting from the cyclone/floods.

Bangladesh Mohila Forum

Bangladesh Mohila Forum Central Committee opened a relief-collection camp at 3 pm on Thursday in front of National Press Club. Members of the forum have already despatched a large quantity of oral saline and water purifying tablets for the cyclone battered people.

Besides, a Relief Team headed by Advocate Ferdous Sultana, President, Mohila Forum will start for Chittagong with relief materials today.

Gono Shastha Kendra

Gono Shastha Kendra of Dhaka has launched a massive relief operation in Chokoria, Kutubdia and Moheshkhali upazilas of the district with relief materials worth over Taka one crore.

Distribution of 20,000 pieces of chapatti daily, desalination of water, medicine, distribution of chira, gur, candles and match boxes are among the first phase of relief works of the kendra.

Rangpur Dinajpur Rural Service

Rangpur Dinajpur Rural Service (RDERS), a non government organisation, on Thursday started ferrying its relief materials from the capital to Chittagong.

The relief goods, carried by HC-130 transport planes, will be despatched to different cyclone-affected areas by helicopters, said a press release.

RDERS has brought in 180 tonnes of emergency relief goods of Tk 2.67 crore in four chartered flights from Europe. It has been financed by the Geneva-based Lutheran world Federation, and its related agencies in Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland, Germany, USA, Canada and Australia. The goods included tents, tarpaulin, water containers, emergency ration, high protein biscuits and water purifying tablets.

Bangladesh Army

Armed Forces relief operations in the cyclone hit coastal areas and off-shore island are going on unabated.

The massive relief efforts by the army personnel are continuing in all the cyclone affected areas and they distributed relief materials among the affected people on Thursday.

Bangladesh Navy

Bangladesh Navy ships during the last 24 hours despatched 42 metric tons of food's stuff and relief materials to the cyclone-hit areas of Sandwip, Kutubdia, Manpara, Bhola, Char Nizam, Char Kukri Mukri and other outlying and inaccessible islands.

The relief goods received from different government and

non-government agencies included rice, mola, molasses, potato, chira, salt, tinned food, biscuit, medicine, water container, utensils, house-building materials, garments and other items of day to day requirement.

Bangladesh Air Force

Bangladesh Air Force is continuing its relief and rescue operations in the cyclone-battered areas of the off-shore islands. BAF transport aircrafts to-day despatched potato, dry food, clothing etc from Dhaka to Chittagong. BAF helicopters also carried its relief mission from Dhaka and Chittagong to ferry dry food, clothing and other essential items to different affected areas of the remote islands.

State Bank of India

The employees of the State Bank of India in Dhaka have contributed their one day's salary for the cyclone-battered people of Bangladesh, a bank press release said. The money will be sent to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund soon.

Hearing of writ against Wage Board continues

The hearing of the writ petition challenging the implementation of the Wage Board Award for Journalists and employees of newspapers and news agencies continued for the second day on Thursday before the Division Bench of the High Court Division.
