

Organisations continue relief operation

Different non-governmental organisations and individuals have distributed various relief goods and other necessary materials including crop seeds among the cyclone-stricken people of the southern districts.

BNP

A meeting of Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) Central Relief Committee on last Tuesday urged all to donate to its fund.

BNP permanent committee member and former Education Minister Prof. Abdul Baten distributed 250 maunds of rice and wheat and 10,000 Taka in cash among the victims of Patuakhali district.

A relief team headed by A. Rab Chowdhury, Member of Parliament, left Dhaka for

Noakhali with huge quantity of relief materials.

A team headed by the Convenor of BNP Relief Committee and Law Minister Mirza Golam Hafez distributed food, medicine and tubewell among the victims of Chittagong.

CPB

A five member team of the Communist Party of Bangladesh returned to Dhaka after five days of relief operation in Chittagong cyclone-hit areas. The team reported lack of coordination and corruption in distribution of relief materials in some areas. The team said some musclemen forcibly took away relief goods from the distributors.

Jamaat-e-Islami

A relief team of Jamaat-e-Islami with three-truck-loads of relief goods for the cyclone affected people left Dhaka for Chittagong on Sunday. The relief goods include rice, pulses, molasses, medicine and clothes.

CARE

CARE Bangladesh will distribute emergency food packages under its cyclone relief programmes among 54,396 families representing 3,26,370 persons in nine worst cyclone hit upazilas during the next one week. This will cover only 15 per cent of the total 3,53,300 families of these upazilas estimated by the CARE officials. The upazilas are Sandwip, Banskhali, Anwara, Maheshkhali, Chokoria, Sitakunda, Cox's Bazar, Patiya and Kutubdia.

Daehan Synthetic Fiber Co. Ltd

Daehan Synthetic Fiber Co. Ltd., on Saturday donated 3,000 US dollars to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund for the cyclone victims. Daehan is the biggest Polyester Fiber, Polyester Filament Yarn and Acrylic Yarn manufacturer of South Korea and one of the biggest exporters of those products in Bangladesh.

Telecom workers

A relief team of Bangladesh Telecommunication Workers and Employees Council led by the organisation's Secretary General Md. Rafiqul Islam will leave for Chittagong to distribute Tk. 70 thousand (cash) and goods worth Taka one lakh among the cyclone-affected people of Chittagong. Two teams of the organisation are already conducting relief operations in Chittagong and Sylhet.

Habib group of Pakistan

Habib Group of Pakistan on Sunday donated Taka five lakh to the Pakistan Prime Minister's relief fund for Bangladesh cyclone, according to Pakistan High Commission sources in Dhaka.

Vice-chairman of the group M K Saraji and a senior executive Hossain Oholami who are now in the capital called on Pakistan High Commissioner to Bangladesh, Mr. Anwarul Kamal at his office on Sunday morning and presented him a cheque for Taka five lakh for Pakistan Prime Minister's Relief Fund for Bangladesh cyclone.

While making the presentation Mr Saraji said they had been importing raw jute from Bangladesh for the last 20 years and this contribution was token of goodwill towards the brotherly people of Bangladesh.

The High Commissioner commended the Habib Group for the gesture.

HRB

Three hundred and fifty bags of relief materials, collected by Bangladesh Rural Development Board (BRDB) for the cyclone affected people were handed over on to the LGED and Cooperatives Minister, Abdus Salam Talukdar.

The relief materials, donated by the members of different cooperative societies included garments, rice, wheat, chira, potato and utensils, a press release of the rural development board said.

Thirty three lakh members of the cooperative societies in 452 upazilas of the country will also donate one Taka each for the cyclone-hit people.

The money will be given to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund in a weeks time, the press release said.

Agrani Bank

The employees of Agrani Bank of Tangail region on Thursday donated Tk. 45,230 to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund for the cyclone-hit people. The employees also donated 716 pieces of cloths and some utensils to the District Administrator's Relief Fund.

Caritas

Caritas has distributed relief goods worth Taka three crore which include foods, kerosene, match boxes, clothes, utensils, tents, tarpaulin and hurricane. It also distributed high protein biscuits, emergency medicines, jerrycans, oral saline and water purifying tablets among the people. Besides, Caritas has undertaken a Taka 30 crore comprehensive rehabilitation programme in the affected areas.

Chattagram Samity

Chattagram Samity in Dhaka has opened a Relief Coordination Centre at Momin Road to distribute relief materials of the samity. A relief team of the samity headed by its President and ex-deputy Prime Minister Mr. Jamaluddin Ahmed, arrived in Chittagong a few days ago with huge quantities of relief materials. The re-

lief team has already distributed rice, pulse, chira, potato, condensed milk, saree, lungi, plastic sheets, water purifying tablets and oral saline among the cyclone and tidal bore affected people of Moheshkhali, Kutubdia, eas of Chittagong. They distributed about 1000 packets of relief goods consisting of foods, sarees, lungis, utensils and candles. They also donated a sum of Taka 15,000 to the Sandhani — a charity organisation of medical students for

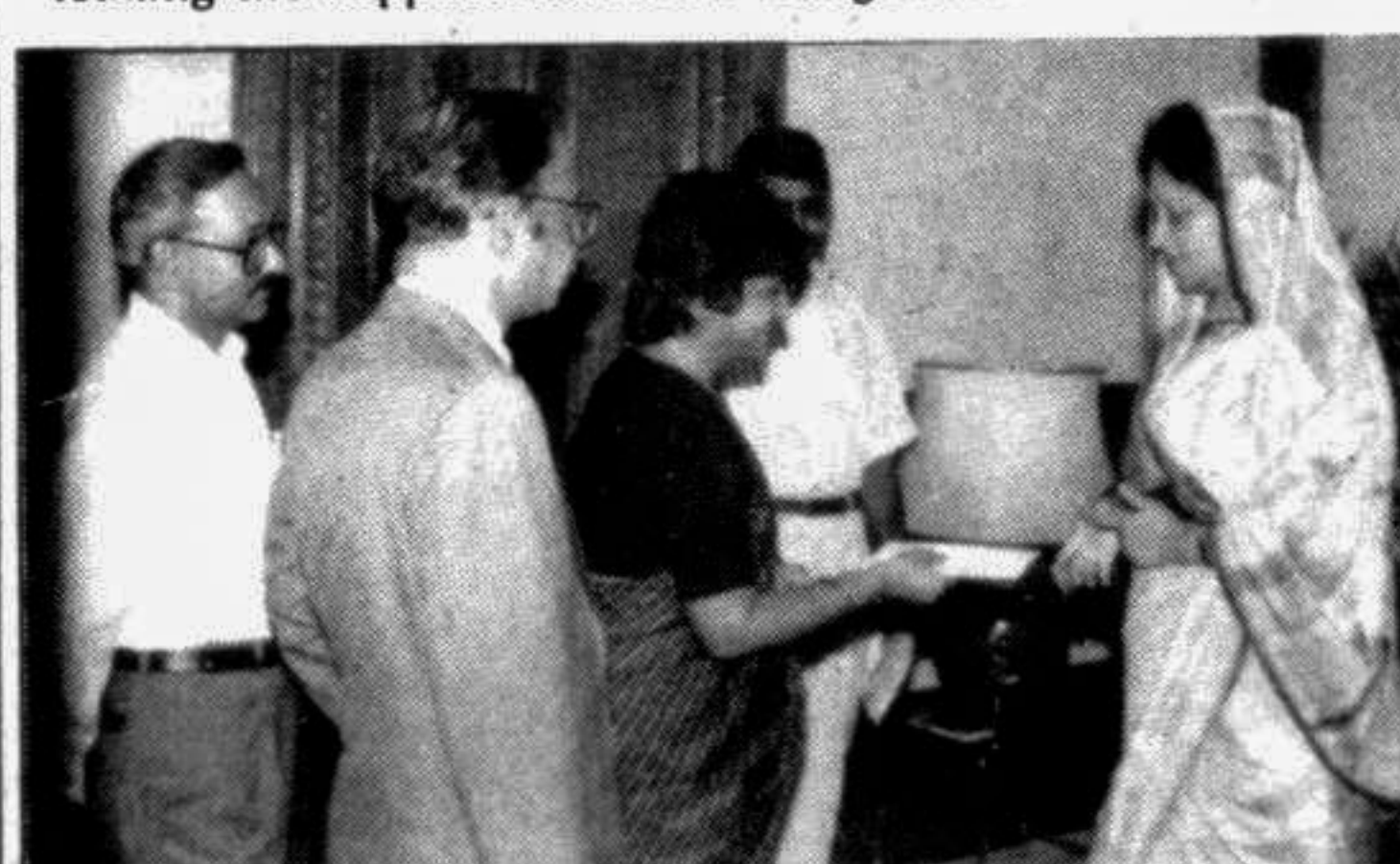

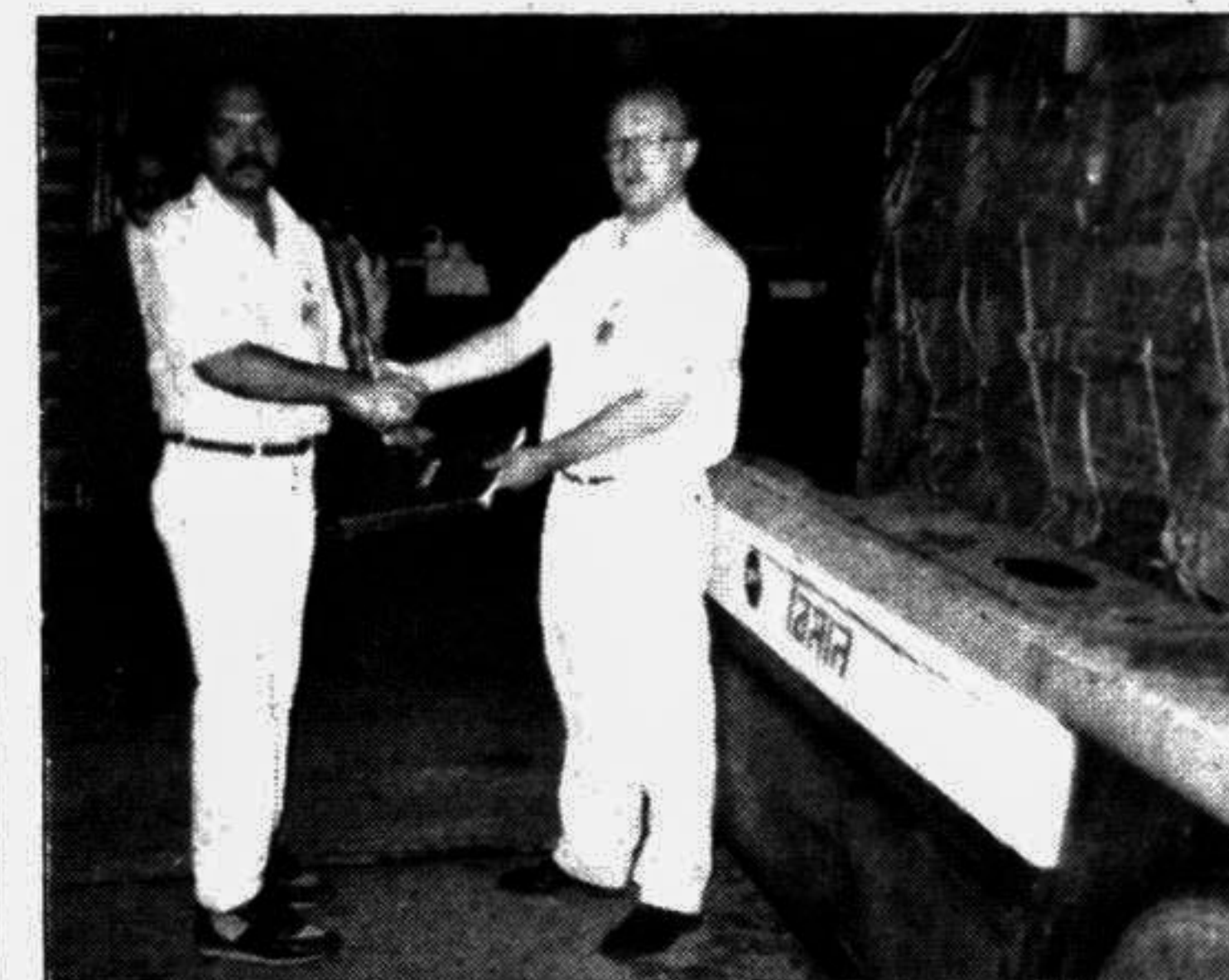

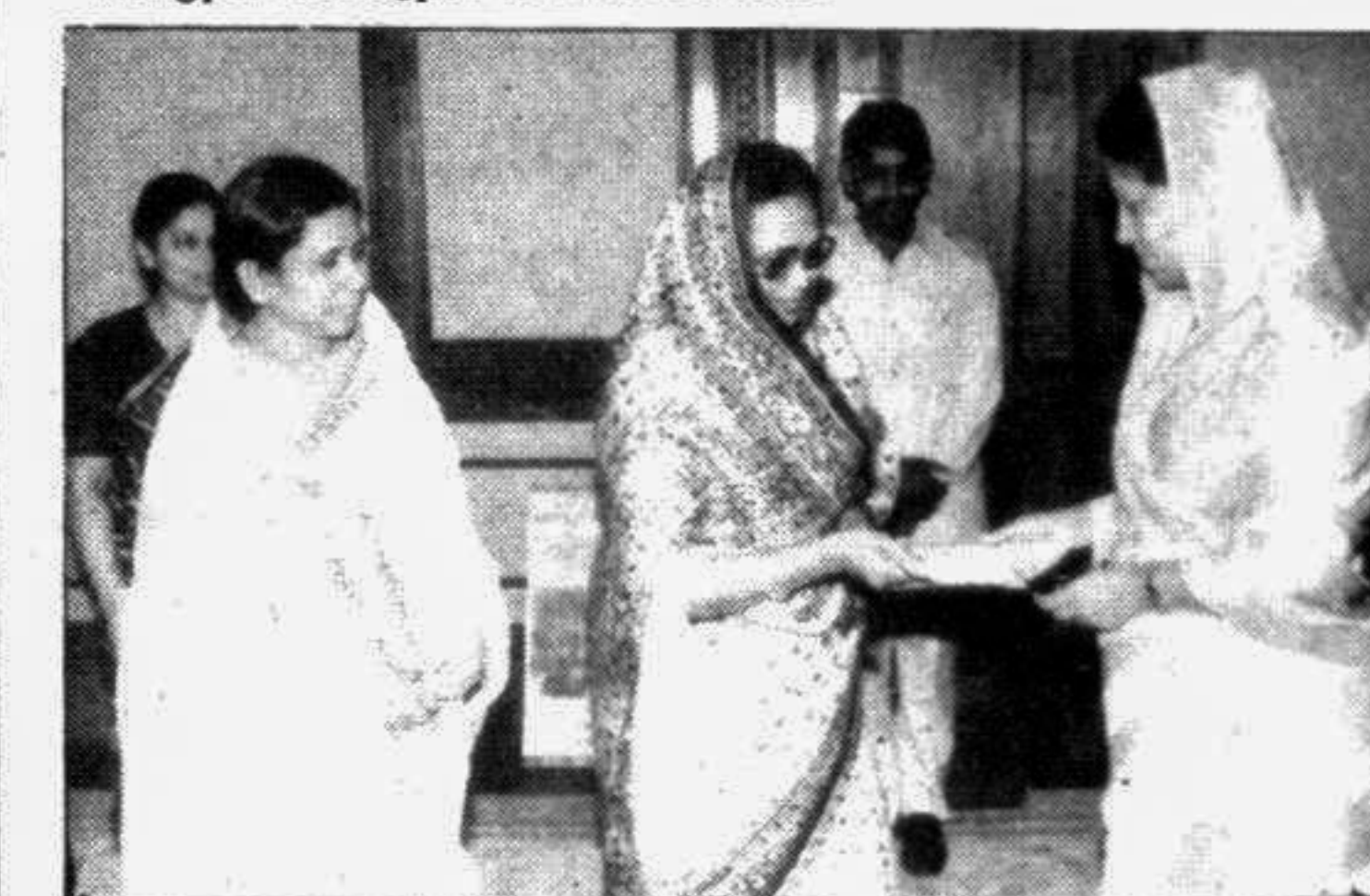
