Waterborne diseases spread fast

Saifur says many of donors' terms unreasonable

Finance and Planning Minister Saifur Rahman Wednesday termed "unreasonable" many of the conditionalities put by the aid giving countries which cannot be borne by Bangladesh, reports UNB.

Conditionalities like withdrawal of subsidy on agricultural inputs and import liberalisation conflict national interest. Rahman said while speaking at a meeting with members of the Bangladesh Chamber of Industries (BCI) Wednesday afternoon.

The pre-budget meeting was held to exchange views on fiscal measures aiming at speedy growth of industries.

"We are equally concerned as you and the government will try to the last minute to protect national interest in dialogues with donors," he told the industrialists.

The Minister is going to Paris on Saturday for the Bangladesh Aid Club meeting

The industrialists vehemently opposed donors' conditionalities saying those will greatly hamper growth of industries and render the economy import-oriented.

Publication of the list of bank loan defaulters was a ma jor issue that came up at the meeting. Some industrialists alleged the list projected "halftruth" about the loanees' real

"Take action against the willful defaulters but those who are victims of government policies and internal and external factors should get due

consideration and compensation," said A M Subid Ali, President of the Chamber of Indus-

Rahman pointed to the "extremely low" recovery bank loans. He however held out categorical assurance that the honest and those fell victims of circumstances would get due compensation.

"Our intention is not to malign anybody by publishing defaulters' list, we only want loans be paid back so that the money is invested in new ven-

"Donors have put strong pressure on the recovery of loans and also the government wants seriously to bring discipline in financial sector." the Finance Minister added.

BSS adds: The Finance Minister said the BNP government believed in market economy and would like to see that competition replaced

monopoly. We want minimum restrictions and free the industry and trade from the clutches of the few individuals,' the Finance

and Planning Minister said. Stressing on reducing the expenditure on unproductive sector, the Finance Minister said the government was committed to increasing spending on development activities. Our efforts would be to generate economic and productive activities through pub-
