Bangladesh Rifles' relief, rehabilitation, medicare and burial operations in the cyclone-hit areas are going on in full swing. One BDR Medical Team attended 195 injured persons and distributed medicines among the cyclone victims.

CIRDAP gets \$ 2.50 lakh Japanese aid

The government of Japan has provided 250,000 US dollars to CIRDAP for undertaking two research, two action research and one documentation projects during 1991, reports BSS.

Toshio Saiki, Ambassador of Japan in Bangladesh, handed over a letter to this effect to ATM Shamsul Haque, Director, CIRDAP, at a simple function, held at CIRDAP headquarters in Dhaka on Wednesday.

Japan has been supporting the activities of CIRDAP from its inception. The total contribution of Japan to CIRDAP for projects, including the current one, amounts to 2,365 million US dollars. The government of Japan also provided 380,000 US dollars for meeting the initial establishment cost of CIRDAP.

In his speech, the Ambassador of Japan assured his country's continued support to CIRDAP. He mentioned that CIRDAP in collaboration with the United Nations Centre for Regional Development (UNCRD), located in Nagoya, Japan, has initiated a 5-year project on disaster management, which started in Bangladesh in 1990.

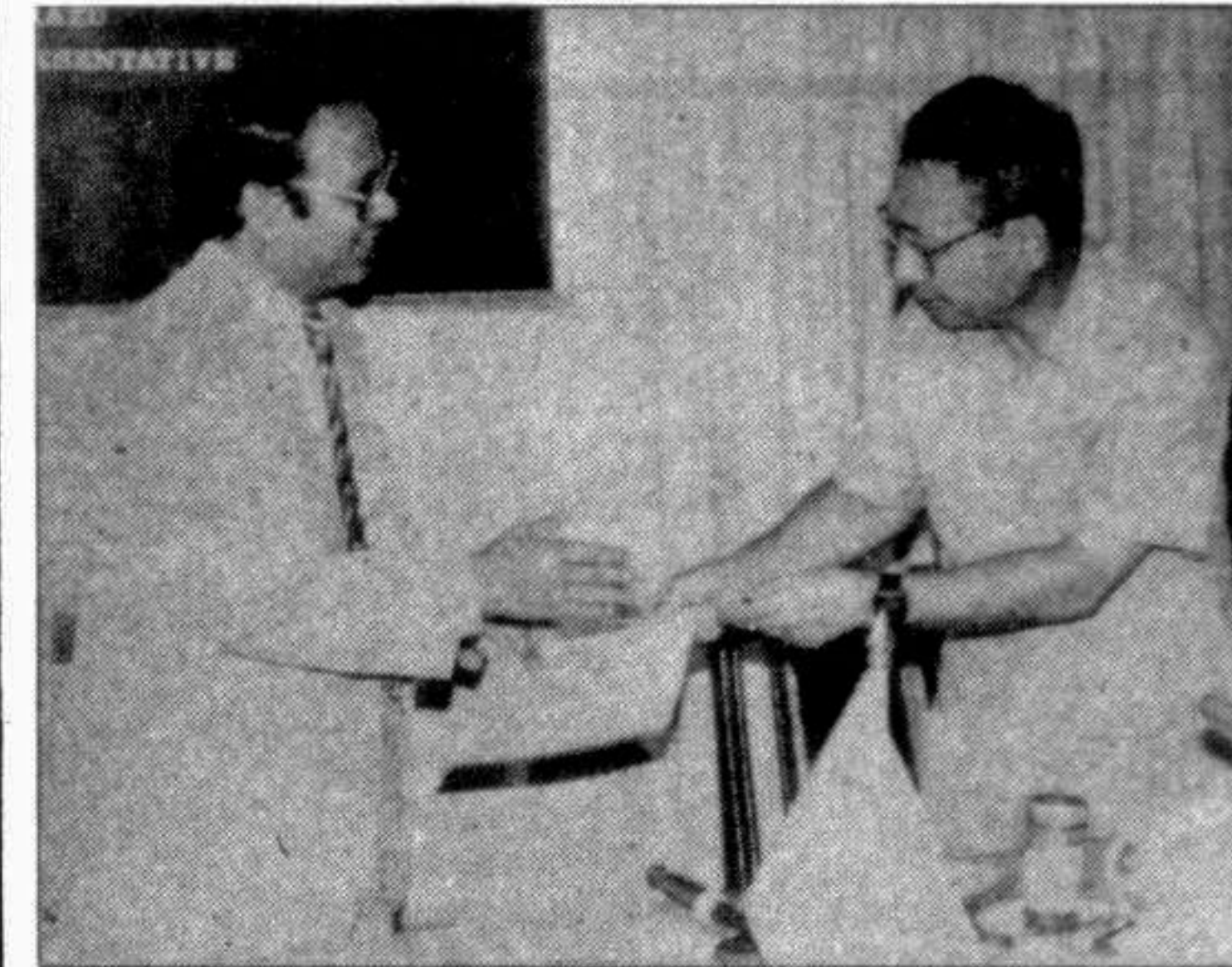
