Prices of all brands of powdered milk have shot up abnormally in different markets of the district causing inconvenience to the consumers. reports UNB.

Sources said, a tin of 2 kg Anchor is being sold at Taka 270, a tin of 2 kg Red Cow costs about Taka 265 while Dano is being sold at Taka 270. Another brand cereal Viva is selling between Taka 100 and

120 while Cerelac and My boy of 400 grams are being sold at Taka 110.

A section of dishonest traders are making windfall profit by creating artificial scarcity of skimmed milk and other brands of baby food.

Meanwhile, prices of essentials have also registered a sharp rise adversely affecting the people over the last few days.
