

Indonesian dress show in aid of cyclone victims

The Indonesian Embassy in Dhaka will present world famous dress designer Even Tampubolon, an Indonesian, in a tea and dress show to be held on June 5 at Hotel Sonargaon at 4-30 pm at the hotel's ballroom in aid of Bangladesh's cyclone and tidal surge victims, says a Press release.

Organised by Dia Productions, the dress show will unveil latest trends in men's and women's wear. All the money to be raised on the occasion will be donated to the cause of the cyclone victims. Tickets will be available at Dia, Hotel Sonargaon.

The noted Indonesian designer Even Tampubolon has agreed to visit Bangladesh to join the dress show to express sympathy for distressed millions.

Meanwhile, the Government of Indonesia has given humanitarian assistance consisting of 14 tons of medicine, food and clothes for the victims of April 29 cyclone and tidal bore of Bangladesh. Brigadier MSA Bhuiyan, PSO to the Supreme Commander, representing the government of Bangladesh received the relief materials. Besides, Dharma Wanita, Indonesian Women's Organisation, Dhaka, donated relief materials in Chittagong. The Indonesian Scouts Pramuka, Dhaka Unit together with members of Indonesian Community in Dhaka also donated relief materials through Bangladesh Scouts in Dhaka.

Relief operations continue

More organisations and individuals continued donations to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund as well as carried out relief operations.

Army

Members of the Bangladesh Army are continuing relief operations at the cyclone hit coastal areas and offshore islands, an ISPR press release said here Thursday.

The army teams are carrying on their relief activities along with the local administration, NGOs and other concerned agencies.

Comilla Area troops Thursday distributed 35 and a half metric tons of rice, nearly 19 metric tons of wheat and about one metric ton of chira and gur at Sandwip, Hatiya, Begumganj and Chitkhil.

They also distributed sizeable quantities of other relief materials including biscuits, potatoes, tinned food, candles, kerosene oil, bleaching powder, soaps, clothes, baby suits, sarees, lungis, shirts, ladies' clothings, old cloth, blankets, tarpaulins, utensils, jerry cans and relief boxes, the press release said.

Bangladesh embassy in Japan

Donations equivalent to Taka 3.22 crore have been collected so far by the Bangladesh Embassy here for the Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

The embassy has opened an account with the Dai-ichi Kangyo Bank which has thousands of outlets across Japan for receiving donations for the cyclone affected people of Bangladesh.

The donations are being extended by Japanese individuals, student foundations and other organisations.

British operation

Royal fleet auxiliary ship 'Fort Orange' will continue relief missions till June 3, a press release issued by British High Commission in Bangladesh said on Thursday.

Fort Orange's four Sea Kings with six Rigid Raider craft have delivered more than 250 tons of stores. The relief materials include wheat, rice, cooking oil, cooking utensils,

clothing, hurricane lamps and building materials. They have also sent medical teams and other aid workers to offshore islands.

HR

Bangladesh Rifles relief, rehabilitation and medicare operations in the cyclone hit areas are going on in full swing, a BDR press release said here Thursday.

Twelve sections of BDR personnel have been deployed in the tornado and cyclone affected areas of southern Bangladesh.

BDR personnel distributed a sum of Taka 40,000, 330 pieces of shari, 15 pieces of lungi, 255 metre marking cloth, and 10 tents among the cyclone victims of Cox's Bazar sadar upazila.

They also distributed 14,353 tons of wheat among the cyclone affected people of Teknaf upazila.

BDR personnel also distributed cash Taka 9,000, 8 pieces of spoon, 6 pieces of bowl, 27 pieces of baby set, 30 pieces of shari, 27 pieces of vest cotton, 2 pieces of lungi, 86 pieces of old garments, 13 pieces of blanket, 5 tin biscuits, 26 kg molasses, 85 kg chira and 1 piece of thami among the cyclone victims of Ukhtia upazila.

Italy

The Italian government has provided four emergency

health kits each of which contains drugs and medical supplies for 10,000 people for a period of three months, an official handout said Thursday.

The Italian Ambassador to Bangladesh, Sandro Maria Sigla, handed over the concerned document on Health and Family Welfare Minister Chowdhury Kamal ibne Yusuf at the latter's secretariat office.

The World Health Organisation representative, Abe Sundre, and some Italian doctors who have been working in the cyclone affected areas were present.

The Italian Ambassador briefed the Health Minister about the kits which would help alleviate the sufferings of the 40,000 distressed people in the cyclone affected areas.

CONCERN

CONCERN is running a major relief operation in the upazilas of Anowara, Bashkhal and Chittagong Metropolitan areas of Chittagong District and Chakoria Upazila of Cox's Bazar district.

Initially CONCERN submitted a proposal with a budget of Taka 1,34,01,050 which was approved by the Ministry. Subsequently submitted an additional budget of Taka 4,36,57,338. Now the total budgeted amount is Taka 5,64,58,388 for immediate relief.

The CONCERN Emergency Relief Programme initially planned for 9000 families but now it has been increased to about 23,000 families (1,26,500 persons).

Meanwhile, different organisations and individuals Thursday donated Taka 5,65,500 in cash and cheques to Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia received the donations at her Sugandha office.

Those who donated to the Fund include Law and Justice Ministry and Directorates under it, Panchagar Palli Resham Dealer Association, Administration of High Court Mazar Sharif and Berger Paints, Bangladesh.

CARE

CARE Bangladesh, under its cyclone response operations, has so far distributed 54,395 food and ration packages among 3,25,000 distressed people of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar districts, a CARE press release said Thursday.

This packages were in addition to the 6,600 packages distributed immediately after the cyclone on Hatiya and Bhola islands and the coastal areas of Noakhali.

Under the second phase of operations, CARE will establish 24 service centres in different affected upazilas to provide health outreach services and supplementary feeding for

pregnant or lactating women and children under the age of two.

The centres will provide quick growing vegetables seed and promote its appropriate use through outreach activities and they will also distribute cooking utensils which might have been lost during the cyclone. Each centre will be staffed with a nurse, health educator, health extensionists and supplementary food distribution manager.

Stranded Pakistanis plan long march

The Stranded Pakistanis General Repatriation Committee (SPGRC) Thursday declared to launch the second 'long march' towards their homeland Pakistan on August 14 by crossing the international border, reports UNB.

Addressing a crowded press conference soon after the conclusion of four-day 8th Annual General Conference, Chief Patron of the SPGRC Nasim Khan said they will start the march from different points of Bangladesh.

Nasim Khan leader of the SPGRC, urged the United Nations General Secretary to deploy UN forces to monitor the 'peaceful march to Pakistan' in case of obstacle from any quarter.

Expressing concern over the eviction of stranded Pakistanis from their present

shanties all over Bangladesh, Nasim Khan asked the local ministries of Home Affairs and Works to issue a 'firm order not to disturb and harass them until their repatriation'.

He demanded a joint declaration of Pakistan and Rabita Al-Islami about the exact time-table for repatriation of the ethnic minority.

The first meeting of the SPGRC Council will be held at Bogra before the long march, Nasim Khan said.

He called upon the Pakistani Prime Minister to lift the 'so-called embargo on his visit to Pakistan within seven days and issue him visa to meet the head of the government there.

Later, the 69-year old leader of the SPGRC, led a munajat for salvation of those who died in the recent cyclone and tidal bore and prayed for the welfare and progress of the country.

ICFTU to construct 50 cyclone shelters

Leaders of International Confederation of Free Trade Unions (ICFTU) Singapore, Gordon James Mc Coll and Mrs Mc Coll, called on State Minister for Labour and Manpower Rafiqul Islam Mia at Bangladesh Secretariat here Thursday, reports BSS.

They discussed matters related to problems of labourers and unemployment in Bangladesh and stressed the need for more employment facilities and development of working condition here.

They also proposed to set up 50 small shelters for cyclone-hit people on experimental basis.

Islam thanked the ICFTU authority for taking some training programmes for our labour leaders.

Bangladeshis in Japan asked to donate for cyclone-victims

Asian People's Friendship Society in Tokyo has expressed deep sympathy and sorrow for the cyclone affected people of Bangladesh, reports BSS.

A message received in Dhaka Thursday said the General Secretary of the society, Masud Karim, said his organisation had launched a drive to collect fund for the cyclone affected people of Bangladesh. Karim appealed to the Bangladeshis living in Japan to donate generously to the fund.

Tk 13.82 cr CIDA grant for Comilla Proshika

Canada through Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) will give 4.5 million Canadian dollars (about Tk 13.82 crore) as grant to Comilla Proshika, a local NGO, reports BSS.

The grant will support Comilla Proshika's projects that includes establishment of development centres to coordinate group formation and training in rural communities. The grant will also finance activities to enhance the ability of rural population to increase and improve living standard, a press release said.

The High Commissioner for Canada in Bangladesh Emile Gauvreau and Rahatuddin Ahmed, Executive Director of Comilla Proshika Thursday signed an agreement on behalf of CIDA and Proshika respectively to this effect.

Bangladesh elected member of ITI

Bangladesh has been elected a Member of the Executive Committee of the International Theatre Institute for a two-year term in the ITI's biennial world Congress now in session held in Istanbul, Turkey, reports BSS.

According to a message received in Dhaka on Thursday Ramendu Majumdar, Secretary General of Bangladesh Centre of ITI and Nasiruddin Yusuf, Chairman, Bangladesh Group Theatre Federation are representing Bangladesh in the week-long Congress which began in Turkish city on May 26.
