Coconut, betelnut trees can bear fury of cyclones

Coconut, betelnut and palm trees have proved to be strong enough to withstand cyclones and storm surges in the coastal belt of Bangladesh.

Environmentalist Prof Kazi Zaker Husain who had been to the cyclone affected areas of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar twice in the month of May told the Daly Star that the Department of Forests and the coastal people should take note of this if they go for afforestation of the coastal belt.

Recipient of the Global 500 Roll of Honour Prof Kazi Zaker Husain said there could be lakhs of coconut, beteinut and palm trees in the coastal areas to work as natural barriers to killer winds and tidal surges. He said that following the

April 29 cyclone some affected families took coconut and coconut water when there was no food and safe drinking water for days. Coconut and palm trees also grow well in the coastal areas, he said.

Prof Husain said the newly formed islets which were worst affected by the cyclone and storm surge are actually not suitable for human habitation, because these landmasses have not yet stabilised through 'ecological succession'.

Population pressure and poverty compel to live in these areas despite the risks. However, since they live there adequate precautions should be taken for their safety, he

The coastal areas of Bangladesh have been vulnerable to cyclones and storm surges for centuries, and will continue to be so. If we live in the Sundarbans we should keep in mind the ever present danger of being attacked by Royal Bengal tigers, he ob-

Prof Husain said maximum loss of life and property could be attributed to high density of population in the coastal areas and the use of 'kutcha' (thatched) dwelling houses which are easily destroyed by cyclones. He pointed out that few pucca structures of schools, mosques, and madrasahs were damaged by the April 29 cyclone.

People affected by the cyclone said they got cyclone warning messages but did not vacate their homes because (a) they did not believe that disaster of such a magnitude would befall them, (b) they had difficulty to move to shelters as there was no road or transport, (c) they feared their belongings would be looted.


