

### Inclusion of disaster management in engineering curricula stressed

Prof. M. Shahjahan, Vice-Chancellor of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) Thursday called upon the politicians, planners, scientists, technocrats and concerned persons to take initiatives for the proper development of technology and its appropriate application for the overall advancement of the country, reports BSS.

He was speaking as the chief guest at the inaugural session of a two-day seminar on "Engineering education in the development of technology" which began at the seminar room of BUET.

The inaugural session of the seminar, organised by the Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology Teachers Association (BUETTA), was presided over by Prof. Jasim-uz-Zaman, president of BUETTA.

Referring to the discouraging situation prevailing in the field of local technology, Prof. Shahjahan proposed co-ordination among the several sectors of technology through specific direction and technological planning. He also stressed the inclusion of the subject of natural disaster management in engineering academic curricula.

Md. Abdus Sobhan, Fellow of Institute of Engineers, Bangladesh (IEB) presented his paper on "Present civil engineering education system of our country in the opinion of an adviser engineer."

Prime Minister Begum Zia extended her thanks to the government and people of the Soviet Union for their concern regarding cyclone affected Bangladesh and the assistance provided by them in this respect.

She hoped that the existing friendly relations between Bangladesh and Soviet Union would strengthen further in the coming days.

### Plea to declare Ctg as industrial calamity zone

CHITTAGONG, June 6: National Association of Small and Cottage Industries of Bangladesh (NASCIB) demanded of the government to declare greater Chittagong as industrial calamity zone, reports UNB.

Addressing a press conference at the local Press Club Wednesday NASCIB President Alhaj Jahangir Chowdhury also urged the government accept its six-point demand and provide immediate financial assistance for smooth running of the cyclone battered industrial units.

The demands include providing rehabilitation credit at concessional rate of interest, granting project finance on priority basis and sanctioning of working capitals.

About 167 industrial units in BSCIC estates of Kalurghat, Sholohahar, Fauzdarhat and Pathya suffered a loss of about Tk 61 crore during the recent devastating cyclone, Chowdhury said.

Besides, the cyclone also caused damage to the 600 non-BSCIC industrial units the loss of which was estimated at about Tk 8.5 crore, he added.

### Enforcement of law on environment pollution demanded

Bangladesh Peace and Human Rights Journalists Forum (BPHRJF) held a discussion in observance of 'The World Environment Day' at its office in Dhaka on Thursday, reports BSS.

The speakers at the discussion urged the government for strict enforcement of the law on environment pollution and taking appropriate preventive measures against environmental pollution of which the human beings were the worst victims.

Presided over by Bablu Rahman, President of the Forum, the meeting was also addressed, among others, by Mesbah Ahmed, Mahub Alam, Shahidul Islam and Masudul Hassan.

### Tk 4 cr sanctioned for agri rehabilitation programme

CHITTAGONG, June 6: Bangladesh Agriculture Extension Department has sanctioned over Taka 4 crore under agriculture rehabilitation programme for 14 upazilas and two areas of Chittagong metropolises.

The Deputy Director of the Department told BSS today that over Taka two crore would be spent for aush and Taka two crore for amon seasons. The agricultural sector of the district suffered a loss of Taka 14 crore on account of the devastating cyclone and tidal surge of April 29.

The department has also sanctioned Taka 14 lakh under small agricultural instruments distribution programme which will be distributed among the farmers by the end of this month.

Taka one lakh in cash for each upazila was given to the farmers through district administration.

The Agriculture Extension Department has so far distributed a total of 2,450 kg of six varieties of vegetable seeds and 1000 kg of amon seeds among the upazilas to the district through upazila administration.

The Deputy Director said a Taka 12 crore long-term agricultural rehabilitation programme for the year 91-92 has been submitted to the Ministry of Agriculture for the district.

Besides, the Japan government has offered 1500 million Yen (approximately 37 crore Taka) for Bangladesh under special consideration of 1991's Kenedy Round Grant for providing food assistance to the cyclone affected people. The wheat will be bought from the United States. This will enable Bangladesh to buy 76,000 metric tons of wheat.

"Rohinga Muslims are being deliberately eliminated and forced out of the country by the tyrant military regime of Myanmar," said a press statement of RSO received here today.

Dr. Mohammad Yonus and Syedur Rahman, President and Secretary General respectively of the organisation, issued the joint statement accusing the State Law and Order Restoration Council (SLORC) of unleashing the repression.

The army also encircled the adjoining areas of Budisang, Hayet Suurat and Shikderpara and created a reign of terror in the localities. "Old men, women and even children could not escape their tyranny," they said.
