



India rejects Pak call to make South Asia N-free

NEW DELHI, June 7: India rejected today Pakistan Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's proposal for a five-nation meeting on nuclear non-proliferation in South Asia, calling it a propaganda ploy by Islamabad, reports AFP.

"We find nothing new in these suggestions," an External Affairs Ministry spokesman told reporters here. "They are a rehash of the well-worn Pakistani posture adopted by
