Schools, colleges in Cox's Bazar reopen today

COX's BAZAR, June 7: All educational institutions of the district which remained closed since the April 29 natural disaster, will reopen tomorrow, official source said today, reports BSS.

The decision to this effect was taken at a recent meeting of the district relief and rehabilitation coordination committee held here.

The coordination committee asked the concerned authorities to vacate the educational institutions where temporary relief camps were set up immediately after the cyclone. The inmates who have taken shelter there, will be shifted to alternative places.

The sources said, allout arrangements have been taken to resume normal classes in all the educational institutions in the district from tomorrow.

Meanwhile, the government as well as various non-governmental organisations have decided to give books and other necessary items to the students of the affected areas.

IIRO to build six cyclone shelters

Issam Mohammad Ki Ki, the Chairman of the Relief Operation in Bangladesh of the international Islamic Relief Organisation (IIRO), Jeddah, Saudi Arabia reached Dhaka Friday from Chittagong en route to Jeddah after completion of 1st phase of its relief operation at the cyclone affected areas in Chittagong, says a Press release.

While staying at Chittagong, for last 3 weeks Ki Ki already distributed 250 metric tons of rice, 50 tons of pulse (Musur Dal), 3,500 hurricane lamps 86 numbers of tubewells, 14 numbers of power pumps, dry food like biscuits etc. among the cyclone and tidal surge affected people of Anwara, Banshkhali, Cholaria, Moheshkhali, Kutubdia, Sandwip etc. Besides, 900 kutcha houses are being built with the supply of 106 tons of CI sheets, 18000 cft of wooden posts, 27,00,000 bamboos, 3600 KG nails etc. in different cyclone affected areas in Chittagong.

After completion of the mobile medical assistance to the survivors, a health centre at Pekua bazar of Chokaria has already been opened on May 30 and another 6 numbers of centre will be started shortly in the different cyclone-hit areas and it will be continued for next 6 months.

The chairman of the IIRO disclosed that his organisation was planning to build 6 multistoried cyclone shelters at different coastal areas in Chittagong providing agricultural medical and educational facilities in the normal days. This will be the 2nd phase of the relief and rehabilitation of the IIRO in Bangladesh, Mr Ki Ki

Development of engineering edn stressed

Speakers at the seminar proposed for organising and developing the academic course and curricula for higher engineering education soon. Periodic review of course and curricula are needed to accommodate issues on emerging technologies and technology management, they ob-

served. They also said that engineering professionals should not only to be equipped with technical knowledge but also with the modalities of formulating and implementing

development programmes. Prof. M. Shahjahan, Vice-Chancellor of BUET who was present at the inaugural session on Thursday as the chief guest, urged the politicians, economists, technocrats and concerned persons for the proper development of technology and its appropriate implementation for the overall advancement of the country.

He hoped that the participants of the seminar would be able to find out a guideline for the inclusion of disaster management technology in academic curricula.

Different organisations continued donations to the relief fund as well as carried out relief operations.

Bangladesh rifles

The members of the Bangladesh Rifles are continuing their relief, rehabilitation and medicare operations in the cyclone hit coastal areas, a BDR press release said in Dhaka on Friday.

More than eight sections of BDR personnel and 15 BDR medical teams are rendering round the clock service to the cyclone victims of Kutubdia. Moheshkhali, Teknaf and Cox's Bazar Sadar upazilas.

BDR medical teams are operating in the cyclone affected areas of Cox's Bazar Sadar, Kutubdia and Moheshkhali upazilas. BDR medical teams attended 150 injured persons and distributed medicines among the victims of Kutubdia upazila.

They distributed 11,160 KG of wheat and 558 KG of edible oil among the cyclone victims

of Cox's Bazar Sadar upazila. BDR personnel also distributed 15283 KG of wheat among the victims of Teknaf

BATC

British-American Tobacco Company Ltd (BATC) has donated urgently required medical supplies worth Tk 18 lakh for the cyclone and tidal surge affected people of Bangladesh. British-American Tobacco Co Ltd is the parent company of Bangladesh Tobacco Co Ltd (BTC), says a press release.

The medical supplies were handed over to the Minister for Health, Mr. Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf by Managing Director of BTC, Mr RMH Duncan at the Health Minister's office on Thursday June

The supplies consist of 6000 water purification tablets, 12000 oral rehydration sachets, 750,000 Septrin antibiotic tablets and 750,000 Tetracyclin antibiotic capsules. The consignment was shipped

by air from London with the assistance of British Airways.

Soviet relief

The Soviet union will supply Bangladesh with various relief goods worth US dollar four million, a Soviet Embassy press release said on Friday

The goods include 5,000 tonnes of diesel oil, 1000 tonnes of cement, 10 trucks, eight bulldozers, four scrappers, three tractors and three excavators. The goods will be sent by ships between June and September this year, the press release said.

The government has decided to give these relief goods to Bangladesh despite critical economic situation and natural disasters that took place in Soviet Union, it added.

This is part from the already rendered Soviet help to Bangladesh on behalf of Soviet Red Cross and allocated by the Soviet Peace Foundation and the Soviet Committee for Solidarity with Asian countries.

State Minister for Food Nazmul Huda has called for action plan to strengthen the World Food Council aimed at eradicating poverty and hunger, according to a message received in Dhaka on Thursday, reports BSS.

Addressing the 17th ministerial session of the World Food Council in Belsincor. Denmark, on Wednesday Huda urge the international community and specifically the doveloped countries to come up with new ideas to help the Third World countries.

Huda said Bangladesh in its part had endorsed the global security system for the elimination of hunger and malnutrition and was working ceaselessly to fulfil the objective. He, however, emphasised the joint effort of the international community as a strategy to eradicate hunger.

The State Minister said during the last decade food production failed to achieve its targets in the majority of the Third World countries due to recurrence of natural disaster. In this context, he high-

lighted the widespread destruction caused to life, crops, properties and infrastructure by the unprecedented cyclone and tidal surge on April 29 in Bangladesh's coastal region. He said in its trail the killer

cyclone left over 1,50,000 dead and million homeless. On the heel of the cyclone Bangladesh has again fallen victim to flood in the north-east region. Nazmul Huda met the Agri-

culture Minister of Denmark, Executive Director of World Food Council. He also met Queen Margette II of Denmark in the re-

world-wide due to scientific and technological development it is a tragedy that the goal of reducing poverty and improved access to food by the third world countries remains ever illusive. goal yet, he said. Huda apprised the council meeting that within its country-frame Bangladesh had adopted food security system with an aim to achieving selfsufficiency in its five-year plan.
