





while addressing a press conference at the Press Club on Saturday, the convenor of the Liberty Forum, Justice Choudhury, said 'certain quarters' rejected by the people in the elections were conspiring against democracy.

Justice Choudhury urged all pro-democracy forces to resist the conspirators unitedly so that the elected government could fulfil its term constitutionally.

Pointing out that the government of Prime Minister

crucial issue of the form of government. Replying to a question, he

said that both the parliamentary and presidential system have merits and demerits. adding, "but I favour a balanced system." However, he said that the Parliament should decide the issue.

Going back to the issue of campus violence, Justice Choudhury demanded publication of the recommendations made by the enquiry commission on the Chittagong University situation. He also called for taking effective steps to solve the problems of the Islamic University through consultations with teachers, students and employees of the univer-

The press conference was also attended by leading mem-

bers of the Liberty Forum, in cluding former Foreign Secretary Tabarak Hossain, M A Mohaimen, Dr S D Choudhury and Dr Mahfuzul Huq.

Commenting on the Acting President's recent nationwide speech, Justice Choudhury said the address would further deepen the present tangle instead of resolving it.

Referring to the Acting President's desire to return to his previous position in the judiciary, he said under Articles 22 and 66 of the Constitution. the Acting President should resign from the office of the Chief Justice immediately, and not think about going back to his previous position for preserving the sanctity of the constitution and the judiciary.

Noting that many of the laws enacted during his (Acting President's) time in office, may be challenged in court in the future. Justice Choudhury pointed out that, if at that time, the Acting President remains as the Chief Justice, then the public's confidence in the judiciary may be

Speaking on the upcoming national budget, he urged the government not to impose any new taxes considering the misery of the people in the wake of natural calamities. He opposed any salary increase for government officials and demanded observance of austerity and increased allocation in the education and development sectors.
