Sight Savers Society

The Sight Savers-Royal Commonwealth Society for the Blind (Bangladesh) has been carrying out its relief activities for the cyclone-victims of coastal areas.

According to a press release it has taken up a programme to resettle 15 affected blind persons of Banakhalhi by providing a pair of milch-cows to each of them, built low-cost houses to 55 affected families of Gouranadi, Agaljhara and Banakhalhi. The sight savers is running two medicare centres for a period of three months in Noakhali Sadar upazila and also arranged sinking of two deep tube-wells in Char Jabbar and Char Mohiuddin of Noakhali Sadar upazila.

The organisation has also extended fund for sinking six tube-wells in Betagi Upazila of Barguna district, which has been affected by the recent flood, the press release said.

Special train for Eid

To facilitate the home bound Eid passengers Bangladesh Railway will run special train on June 20 and 21, a press release said on Thursday, reports BSS.

On June 20 one special train each between Dhaka-Chittagong, Dhaka-Noakhali, Chittagong-Dhaka and Chittagong-Noakhali will ply every day. The special train for Chittagong and Noakhali will leave from Dhaka at 11-50 pm while special train for Dhaka and Noakhali will leave Chittagong at 11 P.M. one special for Dinajpur will also leave from Dhaka at 9-30 pm on June 20.

Similarly one special each will operate on June 21 between Dhaka-Chittagong, Dhaka-Noakhali, Chittagong-Dhaka and Chittagong-Noakhali. The special for Chittagong and Noakhali will leave from Dhaka at 9-45 am

while special for Dhaka and Noakhali will leave from Chittagong at 8-30 am.

Apart from these, Railway will also run one pair of additional inter-city train between Dhaka and Noakhali from June 19 to June 21. This special inter-city will leave Dhaka at 7-40 am arriving Noakhali at 1-30 pm and leave Noakhali at 3-30 pm arriving Dhaka at 9-55 pm.

All inter-city trains excepting Barendra and Kapatakshika will ply on weekly off days from June 16 to June 21 and June 24 to June 27. No inter-city train will run on Eid-day.

Plea to keep campus free from terrorism

FAJSHAHI, June 13: Education and Cultural Affairs Minister Prof Badruddoza Chowdhury today called upon the students to devote themselves in their studies as democratic atmosphere is prevailing in the country after the ouster of autocracy, reports BSS.

He underscored the need for keeping the campus free from terrorism and vandalism for the greater national interest.

The Minister was addressing the teachers, students, officers and employees of Rajshahi University at the University Campus this morning.

Presided over by Vice-Chancellor Prof Amanullah Ahmed, the meeting was addressed, among others, by Rajshahi University Teachers Association, President Prof Abdul Hamid, RUCSU Vice President Razvi Ahmed and General Secretary Ruhul Quddus Babu.

Prof Chowdhury said the democratic government was elected after toppling an autocratic regime through a long struggle in which some people

sacrificed their lives for restoration of democracy in the country. Paying tributes to the heroes of Liberation War and other struggles, the Education Minister said the people had elected their government with the hope to make the country happy and prosperous. He said the students had a vital role to play in the educational arena so that the campus always remain free from terrorism and vandalism.

Referring to the education, the Minister said for the first time in the history of Bangladesh, the government had allocated Taka 1255.56 crore in the education sector — the highest of all other sectors.

He said the present government had already introduced "mass education" with a view to "education for all". Elaborating this, he added the government under the leadership of Prime Minister Begum Khaleida Zia wanted to make the country free from illiteracy as it is a curse for national progress.

Special steamer service from June 20

The BIWTC has arranged special steamer service on June 20, 21, 22 and 25 to facilitate the movement of home-bound passengers on the eve of the Eid-ul-Azha, reports BSS.

According to a press release on June 20 three steamers, one each Chittagong, Sandwip and Hatiya will leave Barisal at 9 am, 3 pm and 7 pm respectively. On June 21 one steamer will leave Dhaka for Hularhat at 5-45 pm and another from Barisal for Chittagong at 8-30 pm. On June 22 one steamer will leave Barisal for Hularhat and two others from Sandwip and Hatiya for Chittagong. The departure time of the steamers will be 6 am, 12-30 pm and 7 am respectively.

On return journey on June 25, two steamers from Barisal and Hularhat will leave for Dhaka at 6 pm and 12 noon respectively.

The normal steamer services will remain operational as usual during the same period, the press release added.

Tk 30 cr plan for reconstruction of Karnaphuli Bridge

CHITTAGONG, June 13: The Roads and Highways Department in Dhaka has prepared a Taka 30 crore plan for repair and reconstruction of the Karnaphuli Bridge which was damaged during the April 29 cyclone and tidal surge, according to informed sources, reports BSS.

The bridge on the river Karnaphuli and its connecting roads were constructed at a cost of about Taka 177 crore with the assistance of the Netherlands government. The bridge was damaged when Chittagong port's floating crane Shaktiman reportedly hit it. One hundred metre of

the central span of the bridge has been completely destroyed.

The Chief Engineer of Public Works and Transport Department of the Netherlands recently completed a preliminary survey on the damaged bridge. A final survey of the bridge will be needed before starting reconstruction works, the sources said.

Meanwhile, the Roads and Highways Department has demanded a compensation of Taka 30 crore from the Chittagong Port Authority (CPA) alleging that the bridge was destroyed as it was hit by the port's floating crane Shakti-

man.

The Shaktiman which sank under the bridge is yet to be salvaged.

The bridge with 24 pillars has seven spans. One of the spans of the bridge was completely destroyed. One but seven pillars have no protective measures.

The bridge was constructed on the demands of the people to shorten the distance and maintain vital roadlink between Port City and southern Chittagong.

The sources could not say when the reconstruction works of the bridge would be undertaken.

Principals seek cooperation to maintain peace on campuses

CHITTAGONG, June 13: A meeting of Principals of different colleges held at Paharati College here yesterday stressed the need for maintaining a congenial academic atmosphere in all educational institutions to ensure proper pursuit of studies by the students, a press release said, reports BSS.

The meeting sought the co-operation of all concerned including students, teachers and guardians to put forward a number of suggestions to

achieve the goal.

The meeting was presided over by the Chairman of Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Comilla, Prof Muhammad Abdul Aziz.
