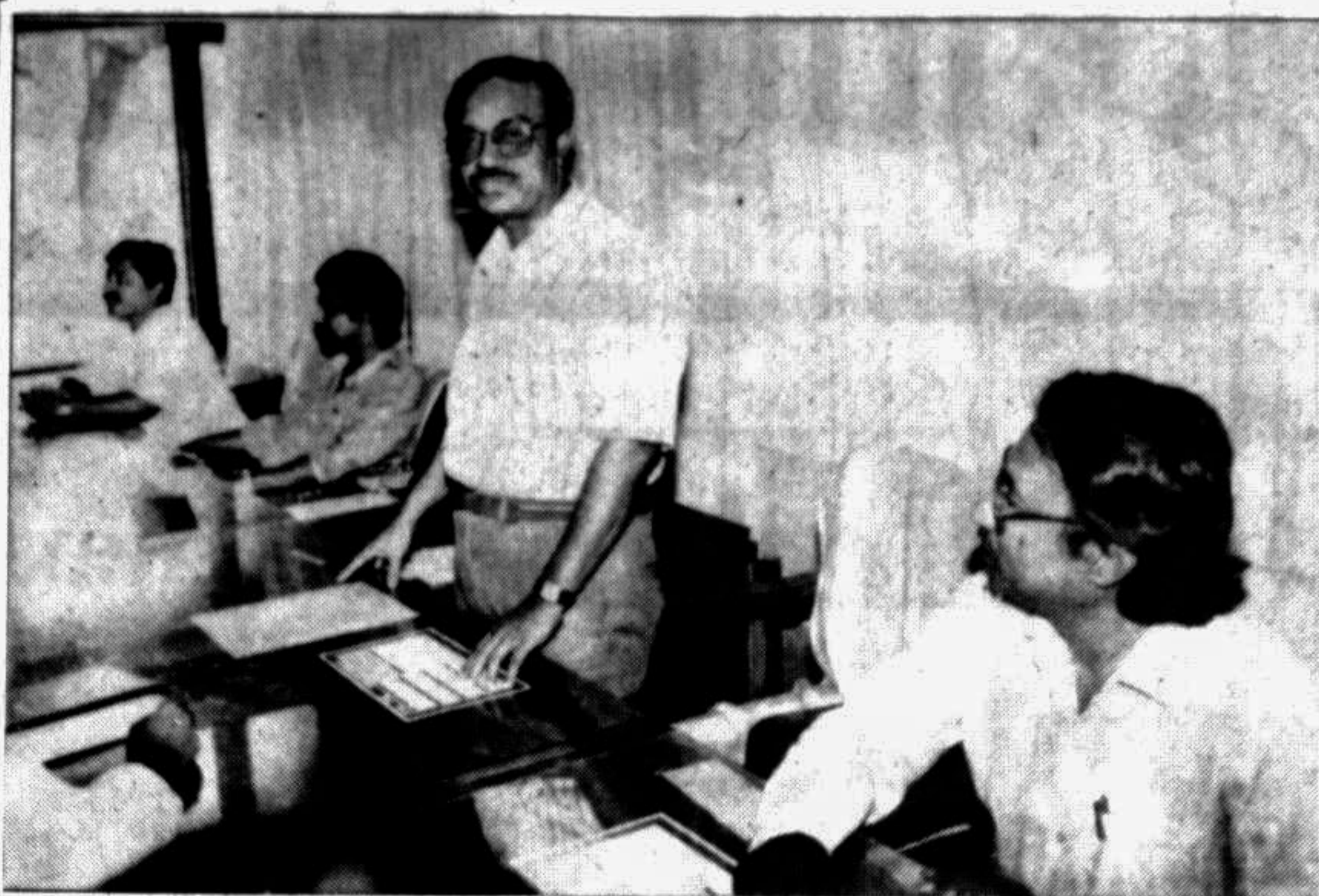

# NGOs take up Tk 105 cr rehabilitation plan

Thirtyfive non-governmental organisations have chalked out a Taka 105 crore post-cyclone rehabilitation plan for the battered coastal belt, reports UNB.

The programme is follow up of Taka 59 crore emergency relief operation carried out by 55 NGOs in the cyclone-hit zone, said executives at a press conference in Dhaka Sunday.

ADAB arranged the news conference at its central office to apprise the press of the post-cyclone relief and rehabilitation activities already carried out and to be taken up by its members.

The Association President, Hazi Faruque Ahmed, General Secretary Khwaja Shamsul Huda, Executive Committee members Jeffry Perera, Khushi Kabir, Dr Mahmud Hasan, Tahera Yasmin and a Swedish voluntary worker, Ms. Agnetha Henkel, addressed the conference.

Jeffry Perera, who is Director of Caritas, a major non-government organisation, explained priorities of the NGO-sponsored rehabilitation programme.

Construction of coastal embankment, house building, construction of multi-purpose cyclone shelters, building 'killas', sinking tubewells, afforestation, supply of agricultural input and fishing equipment are in the priority list.

NGOs would propose to the government to allow fixed-rate radio stations for smooth pre and post-cyclone activities. Perera told reporters, referring to an 'acute' problem of reaching timely warning to remote islands.

Underlining requirements of more cyclone shelters, he announced NGOs had planned construction of 250 multipurpose arrow-shaped shelters, each having the capacity of accommodating about 2,000 people.

Caritas will alone build 50 shelters. Each shelter, capable to resist a maximum wind speed of 160 miles per hour, will cost about Tk 25 lakh.

NGOs will also assist in VOD (Vulnerable Group Development) programme of the government in the coming months, he said.

"Rehabilitation in profession of the cyclone-battered people is the need of the hour, and NGOs will do everything possible," the Caritas Director said.

Referring to his organisation's activities in agriculture rehabilitation, he said 50,000 packages, each weighing 270 grams, of vegetable seeds and 2000 metric tons of salinity-resistant paddy seed had already been distributed.
