## Plea to raise taxable income from Tk 40,000 to Tk 60,000

Bangladesh Tax Lawyers Association (BTLA) demanded removal of existing undemocratic provisions of the tax law and called for setting up of a sub-committee with members of Parliament and others concerned to take necessary steps for the purpose.

Addressing a press conference at Jatiya Press Club Tuesday, the BTLA leaders said that the complicated tax law was formulated by the past autocratic regime and it was ratified along with its undemocratic provisions through the Seventh Amendment of the Constitution.

Shamsur Rahman and M A Salam Tahkur, President and

Secretary General of BTLA addressed the press conference while other office bearers were present.

The BTLA leaders said the national budget of 1991-92 failed to provide any sense of direction to change the present economic condition of the country. They termed the budget as dependant on foreign aid and said that it is also against the interest of the people. They criticised imposition of tax on fertiliser, power, gas, paper, ball pen, edible oil, milk and other essential items and said that the new budget has provided more expenditure in unproductive sector.

The BTLA demanded that tax limit on income should be raised from Taka 40,000 to Taka 60,000 considering price-hike and impact of inflation.

The Association placed a 8-point charter of demand that include recognition of income tax practitioners as Advocates and stoppage of registration by National Board of Revenue, constitution of Tax Appellate Tribunal with experienced and qualified people from the profession, establishment of tax complex and Tax Academy in Dhaka; inclusion of Appellate Tribunal under Law Ministry and some other demands.

## Looting of wealth destroyed infrastructure of economy

Speakers at a seminar on national economy on Tuesday called for combining patriotism, discipline and effective planning for over-all development of the country, reports UNB.

Organised by Islamic Economic Research Bureau (IERB), the two day seminar on "Bangladesh Economy: Future Directions" was inaugurated by professor M Shamsul Haq, Chairman of the University Grants Commission, at the Institute of Cost and Management Accountants (ICMA) auditorium.

Former Chairman of Bangladesh Public Service Commission SM Al Hussainee, chaired the seminar which was addressed by Dr Salauddin Ahmed, advisor, Planning Commission and IERB General Secretary Tajul Islam.

Professor Haq said, unplanned expenditure and rampant looting of national wealth during the autocratic era have destroyed the infrastructure of the national economy.

He called upon the democratically elected government to consider academic recommendations for the overall

uplift of the country.

S M Al Hussainee attributed lack of planning discipline for underdeveloped economy and said without the political determination no development can be achieved.

"Economics is not a party matter, it is a national matter," Hussainee said and urged the politicians to contribute earnestly for country's economic field as they unitedly did in dethroning the autocratic regime.

He singled out "poverty alleviation and human resource development" as top economic priority and suggested setting up of a Ministry for Human Resources Development.

On the opening day, a total of six papers, three in each, were presented in two academic sessions.

Dr Sheikh Maqsood Ali, member of the Planning Commission, presided over the first session while professor Raihan Sharif of Dhaka University chaired the latter.

Dr M Habibullah and noted banker Lutfur Rahman Sarkar discussed the paper by Professor Akhlaqur Rahman on "Development through Self-reliance".

Dr. A T M Jahurul Haq of Dhaka University presented a paper on "Guidelines of Human

DFU aims at implementing different socio-economic projects including MCH & FP at different under-privileged areas of urban and rural areas.

## 1,158 killed in 112 launch mishaps Five sea-going vessels damaged in cyclone

Shipping Minister M K Anwar told the Jatiya Sangsad on Tuesday that 1,158 passengers had been killed in 112 launch accidents from 1976 till to date, reports BSS.

Replying to a question from Prof. Rafiqul Islam (AL-Jessore), the minister said so far Taka 5,86,000 had been paid as compensation on the bases of court verdict. Besides, 67 persons had been given punishment in these accident cases.

In reply to a supplementary question from Begum Matia Chowdhury (AL-Sherpur), Anwar said he would look into the matter whether the launches had any insurance coverage.

He told Dr Mozammel Hossain (AL-Bagerhat), that the loading of excessive number of 12 passengers of the launch operations were the main causes for the accidents.

In reply to a question from Dr Mozammel Hossain (AL-Bagerhat), Anwar informed the House that there are seven terminals and 237 passenger pontoons in the country.

He said Taka 85,35,897 had been realised as revenue from passenger entry fees at the terminals during ten months upto April 30, 1991.

M K Anwar told the Jatiya Sangsad that five sea-going ships had been damaged in the 1991 cyclone and their estimated loss would be Taka five crore.

Anwar was replying to a question from Nurul Islam Moni (Ind-Borguna).

Replying to a supplement-

tary question from Mirza Muraduzzaman (BNP-Sirajganj), the Minister said of the five ships, three belonged to Bangladesh Shipping Corporation. He said their damage was minor adding Taka 1.50 crore would be needed for their repair.

In reply to a supplementary question from Sheikh Fazul Karim Selim (AL-Gopalganj), Anwar informed the House that the damaged ships belonging to BSC are: Banglar Kakoli, Banglar Swapna and Banglar Bani. He said an inquiry it was found that the damage was not due to negligence of the officials.

Replying to a question from Sardar Sakawat Hossain (BNP-Narsingdi), the Shipping Minister said Bangladesh Shipping Corporation has 21 ships in its fleet. He said none of them was out of order.

In reply to a supplementary question from the same member, Anwar said there are 18 ships under private ownership. He said it was the policy of the government to encourage private parties to purchase ships and the government would help anyone if help was sought.

The Minister told the House that there should not be any disparity in the shipping rate between the Bangladesh Shipping Corporation ships and the foreign ships. He however, assured the House that he would look into the matter.

### Nine vessels purchased

Shipping Minister told that the government had purchased nine ocean-going vessels at a cost of Taka 253.84 crore from six countries during the period

## Drug intake through injection dangerous

Deputy Leader of the House on Tuesday told the House that some drug addicts have started taking intravenous drug injection which might lead to killer virus "AIDS", reports UNB.

Prof. Badruddin Chowdhury, Education Minister, replying to questions on drug addiction in the country said, a trend has developed among the youths to take drugs through injection which is more dangerous than cancer.

### Task force formed

Bangladesh Academy of Sciences has formed a task force consisting of eminent scientists to identify the science and technology inputs required for implementing the rehabilitation programmes in the cyclone affected areas, reports BSS.

The task force will also identify the science and technology inputs in disaster preparedness and mitigation programmes and scientific management of coastal areas and offshore islands, according to a press release of the academy.

The task force is expected to submit its report by the end of next month.

### 7 Panels in JUCSU polls

Seven panels were submitted on Monday for the forthcoming JUCSU (Jahangirnagar University Central Students Union) election.

Election Commission said that they have received candidate lists from Shamajtantrik Chhatra Front (SCF), Chhatra League (A-A), Chhatra Mottri, Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), Chhatra League (N-S), Chhatra Jama and Bangladesh Islami Jamaate Awami Communist Party (BJJACP).

JCD submitted its 'Monir Masum' panel.

The pro-Awami League students' organisation failed to decide its sole candidates for the JUCSU polls. As a result, Jahangir Alam and Ruhul Amin submitted their nomination papers for the VP post, while Abu Syed-Al-Mahmud Shapan and Saiful Halim Mollah became nominees for the GS post.

Chhatra Union gave its 'Comrade Shajal-Shamal' panel. SCF submitted its panel with Abul Kamal Azad as VP and Kamal Atahar Hussain as G S.

BCL (N-S) gave its 'Dipu-Mohsin-Fayez' panel.

Faruq-e-Azam Md Abdus Salam and Masudur Rahman have become the V P and G S candidates from Chhatra Mottri (Najmul Islam and Abu Jubaed Khan will contest for the V P and GS post from BJJACP).

Candidates will be able to withdraw their nomination papers on June 20. The Election Commission will scrutinise the candidate lists and present the preliminary candidate list on Tuesday.

Earlier, the Election Commission published the final list of 2188 voters.

The JUCSU election will take place on July 6.

Mean while, security measures would be taken during the election.

No one would be allowed to enter into the campus without valid pass from July 3.
