After the passage of the bill amending Articles 48 and 56, it will be presented to the President for his assent. The President within seven days after the bill is presented to him will put it to a referendum.

A referendam-under Article-142 (1b) shall be conducted by the Election Commission within such a period and in a such manner as may be provided by law, amongst the persons enrolled in the voters list. If the result of the referendum is positive, then it will be deemed that the president has assented to the bill.

Reliable sources told The Daily Star that there might not be major differences between the Treasury Bench's and the private members, bills except that Abdus Samad Azad seeks to revert to the parliamentary system as was envisaged in the 1972 Constitution.
