The setting up of Darul Ahsan University in Dhaka is obviously an encouraging initiative sponsored by the founders with a view to revolutionizing the system of education in Bangladesh. Al-Quran has revealed enormous sources of knowledge which needs proper utilisation for the development of science and technology and natural resources, says a Press release.

This was observed the Iranian Ambassador during his visit to the Institute of Higher Islamic Learning which is the core Faculty of Darul Ihsan University functioning from 1989 in Dhaka.

3 killed in road mishap

Floods worsen Teknaf, Cox's Bazar's situation

The Chairman of the Bangladesh Red Crescent Society (BDRCS) Major General (Rtd) A F M Abdul Huq, said in Dhaka Wednesday that the situation in the cyclone affected areas of Cox's Bazar, Teknaf and Chakoria suddenly worsened due to heavy rains and the resultant floods, reports BSS.

As the situation was returning to normalcy the floods caused by the heavy rains locally and the on-rush of waters from the upper regions exacerbated the sufferings of the people. General Huq said on return from a three-day visit to the cyclone affected areas of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar.

Pay Commission report demanded

Bangladesh Class Four Government Employees' Association in a memorandum to the Cabinet Secretary called for declaring the pay commission Report and implement it with effect from July 1, 1991, reports BSS.

The Association also called for re-fixing the office timing at 7.30 am to 2.00 pm instead of the present schedule and to make timing upto 2.00 pm on Thursday at district and upazila levels.

Its three-point demands also include arrangement for residence for the fourth class employees on priority basis, regularisation of various temporary and contract jobs, introduction of rationing system, fixing retirement age at 60 years and making the last drawn basic salary as the pension.

18,000 surplus employees to be absorbed Rly administration to be recast

The government is planning to recast the Railway administration by putting it under a board to make the sector more efficient and minimise its losses.

Communications Ministry sources in Dhaka Wednesday told UNB the reconstitution of a Railway Board, which existed before 1982, was under active consideration.

Senior officials and experts, the sources said, had already met twice to study the matter and a decision in this regard is likely to be taken soon.

Officials were reportedly studying on the composition of the board, it was learnt.

Under the planned reorganisation, the existing two zones of the railways are likely to be merged with a head office at Chittagong. A liaison office will, however, be maintained at Rajshahi.

The sources said that the planned reorganisation would not cause any termination, as pledged by the new government.

A surplus of nearly 18,000 railway staff and workers are likely to be absorbed in different schemes, according to a plan outlined by the Asian Development Bank (ADB) to cut its recurring losses.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Railways has reopened two of the 21 stations that had been shut down by the last regime and also started running trains in two of the four branch lines closed earlier.

The entire overhauling of the railways is expected to be finalised after the return of Communication Minister Oli Ahmed from Hajj, it was learnt.

Allocation of fund for housing sought

The Bangladesh Nagarik Adhikar Trust urged for the allocation of government funds for the house-building sector for the education and health sectors.
