has been prevailing all over the district of Dinajpur, particularly in the rural areas.

The number of tubewells sunk by the Public Health Engineering (PHE) Department are not adequate to meet the requirements of the people. Out of these tubewells, nearly 20 per cent are out of order for a long time. There is virtually no arrangement for repairing or resinking of these tubewells which have been causing untold sufferings to the people of this district, it is alleged.

According to an estimate, about 1,840 tubewells have gone out of order in 13 upazilas of the district. Besides, a large number of tubewells has also gone partially out of order. They require immediate repair and resinking.

It may be mentioned here that, the Public Health Engineering Department has sunk a total of 8,000 tubewells indifferent areas of the district. And large number of tubewells particularly in rural areas went out of order two to three years ago but no effective measures have been taken to replace them. The local people made several representations replacing these tubewells but neither the Public Health Engineering Department nor the respective union parishads have taken any action in this
