Eight persons were killed and at least 30 others injured when the newly-installed ammonia gas plant at the Urea Fertilizer Factory in Ghorasal, 56 kilometres south of the city, exploded midnight Wednesday.

The dead included the Additional Chief Engineer of the factory AM Manzurul Alam.

The blast took place 10 hours after the carbon dioxide compressor of the plant was put into operation after being renovated by the Japanese Toyo Engineering Corporation.

Seven of the dead were identified as : Manzurul Alam. Additional Chief Engineer (mechanical), Habibur Rahman Khan and Matiur Rahman. technicians (mechanical), Abdul Momin Chowdhury, AST of the factory, Abdul Halim and Ashraf Ali, senior operators and ABM Faridur Rahman, assistant

INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGISTRATION UNDER THE VALUE ADDED TAX SYSTEM TO ALL DOMESTIC PRODUCERS AND MANUFACTURERS, SERVICE RENDERERS, IMPORTERS AND EXPORTERS

It is hereby notified for the information of all domestic producers & manufacturers, service renderers, importers and exporters that, value added tax system is going to be introduced in the country from the 1st of July, 1991. This system will replace the present excise system in case of all excisable goods except, Tobacco, Natural gas and petroleum products, Newsprints, Gold and products there of, Salt, Bank cheques and ordinary bricks and the present sales tax system in case of all imports. In accordance with the Presidential Ordinance No-26 of 1991, dated the 1st of June, 1991, except for the producers and manufacturers of the goods mentioned in the First Schedule to the Ordinance, and those of the above mentioned goods remaining under the excise system, all importers and exporters shall be required to be registered. The domestic producers of the goods mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Narcotics Control Act, 1990 will however remain outside the purview of the above Ordinance. Certain selected service renderers, namely, Hotels and Restaurants, Decorators, Motor Garages and Workshops, Dockyards, Cold Storages, Commercial Warehouses, Building and Construction Agencies, Advertising Agencies, Printing Presses, Auctioneers, Video Clubs, Telephone, Teleprinter, Telex and FAX Service, Automatic Dry Cleaners, Indentors, Freight forwarders, Travel Agencies, Community Centres, Film Studios, Colour Photo Studios, Survey Agencies, Sweetmeats, and Cinema Halls, will also have to be registered. However, those with annual turnover below Tk 2,00,000 (two lakhs) will not be required to register. In order to complete the process of registration before the 1st of July, 1991, all concerned are hereby directed to immediately collect registration forms from the local Customs, Excise and VAT Circle Office, submit the same duly filled in, back to the Circle Office, and procure Registration Certificates. For details, all concerned are requested to contact the local Customs, Excise and VAT Circle Office.
