

Hearing on Anwar's petition adjourned till today

Hearing of the former Communications Minister Anwar Hossain's petition to quash his trial now pending in the Special Tribunal and Sessions Judge Court, Dhaka, was adjourned till Wednesday in a Division Bench of the High Court Division, reports BSS.

The bench comprised Justice Anwarul Haq Chowdhury and Justice Habibur Rahman Khan.

Meanwhile, the hearing of the two separate bail petitions of former minister Ruhul Amin Hawlader was held on the day before the same court. Moudud Ahmed moved the bail petitions on behalf of Ruhul Amin, Deputy Attorney General, Alhaj M. Shamsul Alam opposed the petition on behalf of the government.

S Korea will donate \$ 1 m for cyclone victims

South Korea will donate additional one million dollars in kind for the rehabilitation of the cyclone affected people of Bangladesh, reports BSS.

Disclosing this, the visiting special envoy of Seoul government, Ambassador at large El Myung Kim, said the items to be purchased against the fresh South Korean contribution would be specified by the Bangladesh government.

Ambassador Kim called on Acting President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed at the President's Secretariat Wednesday morning to brief him on the South Korean plan for rehabilitation of the cyclone-hit people of our coastal belt.

South Korea donated 100,000 U S dollars in cash and 300,000 U S dollars in kind immediately after the devastating natural calamity on April 29 for relief and rehabilitation of the affected people.

Ambassador Kim said Bangladesh could transform their woes into potentials for progress by resolving to win over all their odds. He said the devastation of South Korea during the Korean war in early fifties induced its people to conquer their woes.

Justice Shahabuddin conveyed his thanks to South Korean President Roh Tae Woo and its people for their generous contributions for the well-being of our cyclone and tidal surge affected people.

**Bid to delay Pay Commission decried
Govt employees to begin agitation from July 22**

Bangladesh Government Employees solidarity Council Wednesday threatened to wage a strong movement beginning July 22 if its three-point demand including implementation of the Pay Commission report is not met by them, reports UNB.

Announcing the action plan at a press conference at the National Press Club Wednesday afternoon, the Secretary General of the Council, Syed Mohiuddin accused the government of resorting to an "evil design" for delaying implementation of the Pay Commission report.

Mohiuddin alleged formation of a committee after

submission of the Commission report indicated government intention to avoid its implementation.

The government has constituted a committee for a review of the Pay Commission report, submitted to the government on March 9 this year. The new committee will report to the government by August 31.

Wages of government employees have increased by 38 per cent since June 1983 as against 96 per cent inflation during the period, he pointed out, admitting that dire financial crisis forces the government employees to go into corruption.

The Secretary General of the Council reminded that the government had declared to implement the new Pay Commission by July 1990 and demanded immediate implementation of the report with Tk 2,000 as the minimum and Tk 10,000 as the maximum scale.

"As government employees, we are loyal to any government," Mohiuddin said, denying direct help of any political party in realising their demands.

Besides implementation of pay scale, the government employees are demanding rescheduling of the present 9 am-4 pm office hours to 7 am-

2 pm.

The council will organise a rally in front of the National Press Club on July 22 from where they are expected to announce their future course of action.

The press conference was also attended by Council President Mohammed Motalib Khan, Vice Presidents Mohammed Azur Rahman, Mohammed Kazemuddin and ABM Nazir Ahmed, Organising Secretary Mohammed Shah Alam and Treasurer Mohammad Bahauddin.

4th class employees call to accept 3-point demand

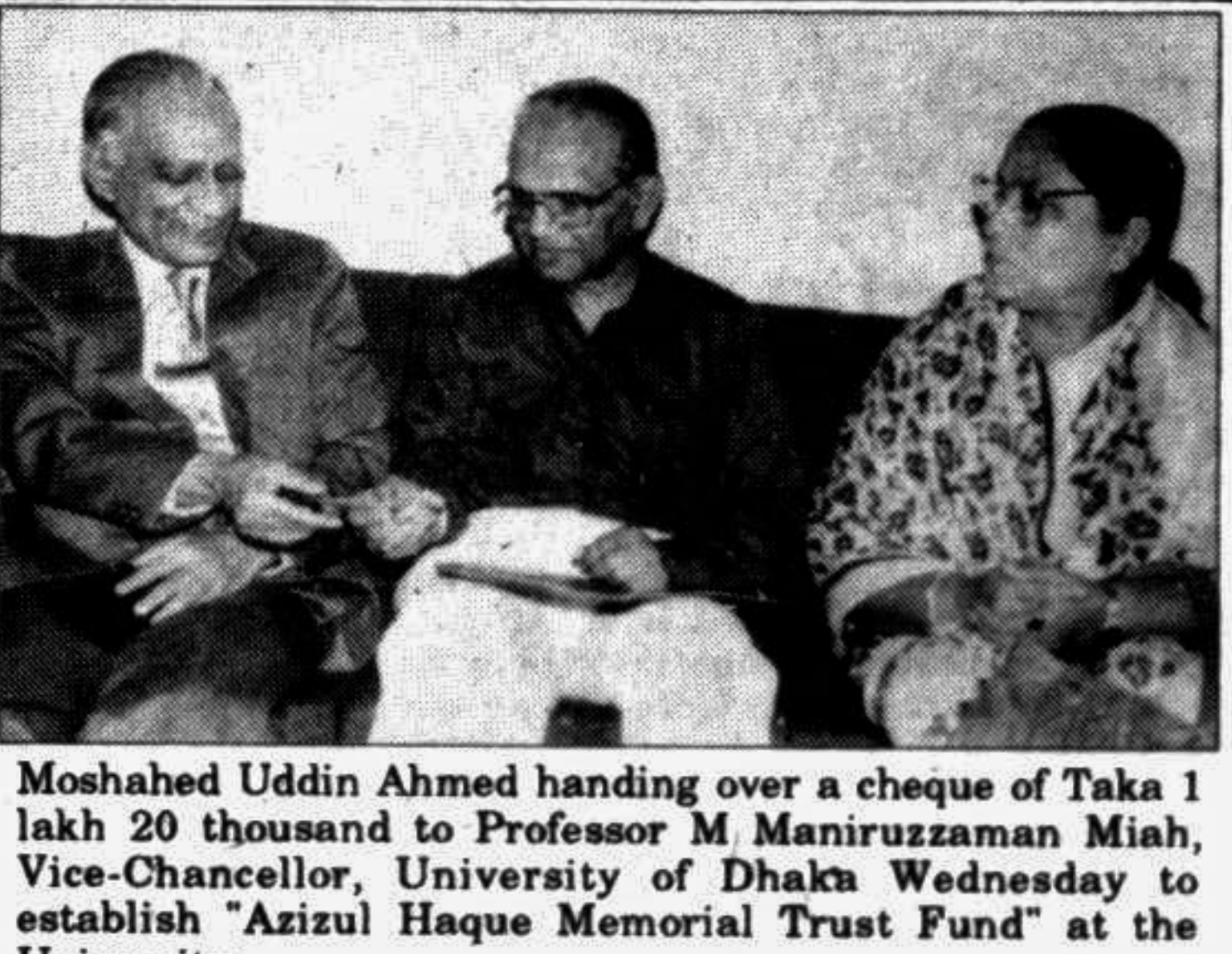

Three trade organisations of the textile sector have urged the government to withdraw the Value Added Tax (VAT) system as its implementation has caused an adverse effect in the sector.

The Bangladesh yarn Merchants' Associations, Bangladesh Cloth Merchants' Association and Bangladesh Hosiery Association said that trading in yarn, cloth and hosiery have completely stopped since June 30 and it has caused grave concern among the trading and weaving community.

They said if the value added tax system is continued to be imposed then this sector, will be ruined and illegal merchandise will flood the market from across the border.
