Children of these destitute families are being forced to take up jobs as rickshawpullers, stone-breakers, shoeshiners, hotel-boys, loaders and as helpers in various workshops to provide succour to their near and dear ones.

They are to work more than 12 hours a day and abide by different precarious condition set by their employers. According to international

labour laws, children below the age of 15 years, can not be employed in hard work.
