sources, over 3000 divorce cases were registered during the last few years in seven upazilas of the district. Husbands abandon their wives for not getting demanded dowry and also by putting slur on their character.

Besides, marriages of minor girls are being solemnised in seven upazilas despite government ban. Girls under 18 years are not eligible for marriage according to the government rule. Local elite have urged the authorities to en-
