The House was then adjourned till 4 p. m. today (Tuesday).

Value Added Tax (VAT) is a new kind of tax proposed by Finance Minister Saifur Rahman to replace sales tax at import stage and excise duty on domestic manufactures and some service sectors for ensuring transparency in taxation.
