# **India moves 25 tonnes** of gold to London

NEW DELHI, July 8: India flew 25 tonnes of gold from its official reserves to London as collateral for future loans if needed to maintain payments of its huge foreign debt, centure is supported by the contain over the past few months as its credit rating has collateral for future loans if needed to maintain payments of its huge foretan debt, central bank governor S Venkttaramann said today, reports Reuter.

He told a news conference in Bombay that the gold, was sent for deposit with the Bank of England on Sunday, Indian news agenties reported.

Venkttaramann said India would bornw against the gold if necessary to keep up its fight to avoid defaulting on foreign debts which bankera estimate at 71 billion dollars.

India is struggling with its worst economic crisis and foreign exchange reserves are down to only a few weeks of imports.

International monetary sources in Washington said last week the central banks of Britain and Japan were trying to put together a bridging loan of up to 450 million dollars for lodia.

Delhi has not commented officially on the possibility of such a loan to tide india over until talks with the international Monetary Fund (IMF) are completed on a loan of between five and seven billion dollars.

Finance Miniater Manmohan Singh told Reuter lant week that major central banks had promised help to India if needed. The IMF money is expected to be available in September.

Venkitaramanan said the gold was sent to London under laws allowing the Reserve Bank of India, the central banks to keep up to 15 per cent of its gold reserves abroad.

In June, india did a "gold swap" of 20 tonnes of gold confiscated from smugglers for about 200 million dollars to keep up loan payments. #### Indo-Pak railway pact extended

NEW DELHI. July 8: India and Pakistan have signed a three-year extension of a bilat-eral ratiway passenger and freight traffic pact, the Indian government announced today, reports AFP.

The agreement was signed here Sunday, two days after the two countries became embruiled in a row over Pakistan's suspension of transit facilities to Indian air passengers in

to Indian air passengers in Pakistan.

The renewal of the railway accord followed the expiry of the old pact on June 30. It was signed by the chairman of the Indian Railway Board, R. D. Kitson, and his Pakistani counterpart, S. R. Poonegar.

Daily services between Amritsar, India and Lahore, Pakistan, via the border towns of Atari and Wagha are to be continued under the pact.

Despite tense relations between the two countries, passenger trains run daily across the troubled border and some 100 to 200 freight wagons play the route monthly, parrying mostly soyabean and other food products from India and serap metal and rock salt from the Pakistan side.

On Priday, India had threatened to retaliate against islamabad's decision to confine indian transit passengers to Pakistani alports, rather than allowing them to stay overnight in hotels.

The Pakistan side said Indian finelligence agencies had been abusing the transit facilities, a charge an Indian Foreign Ministry spokesman denied.

TOKYO. July 8: Finance Minister Ryutaro Hashimoto on Monday ordered Japan's four leading brokerages to restrict business for four days as a penalty for shady dealings that have rocked the financial industry, reports AP.

The ministry also directed brokerages to stop compensating wealthy customers for millions of dollars in investment losses. The compensations and alleged financial dealings with gangsters touched off the scandal.

It's absolutely pitiful that this was going on in the market," a stern-laced Hashimoto told a packed news conference.

The disciplinary action came two weeks after the presidents of Nomura Securities Co.— the world's largest brokerage — and Nikko Securities Co., resigned to take responsibility for the scandal. It also came two days before Prime Minister Toshiki Kaifu was to Jeave for a summit with President Bush in the United States, where the scandal has

Under the Finance Ministry directives, which also apply to Datwa Securities Co and Yamaicht Securities Co, the brokerages are not permitted to solicit business from corporate clients for four days beginning Wedresday.

The brokerages also were told to take internal action, perhaps including salary reductions.

#### Big Five talk arms control

PARIS, July B: The five permanent members of the United Nations Security Council— which are also the world's top arms exporters— opened their meeting here today to discuss ways of controlling and policing the literative trade in weapons. The two-day meeting, the first of its type since World War II, comes in the wake of the invasion of Kuwait by fraq and the resulting Gulf war, which illustrated the dangers of selling potent weapons to potentially aggressive states, reports AFP.

#### Israel urged to sign NPT

CAIRO, July 8: Egypt today called on Israel to ratify the nuclear non-proliferation treaty, as the five permanent members of the UN Security Council were to meet in Paris to discuss curbs on Middle East arms sales. It is inconceivable that an exception should be made for Israel at the expense of Arab countries. Foreign Minister Aury Moussa and in an interview with the liberal party's Al-Wafd newspaper, reports AFP.

#### \$125m EC aid for Romania

BRUSSELS, July 8: Finance ministers of the European Community agreed Monday to grant 125 million deliars in economic assistance for Romania. The ministers of the 12-na-tion trading bloc decided to release the aid even though they have not garnered as much aid as they initially sought for Romania, officials said, reports AP.
