South African athletes rejoiced on Tuesday at their country's readmission to the Olympic Movement after 31 years of isolation, but anti-apartheid radicals vowed to overturn the decision, reports Reuter.

"It's great news," said marathon runner Willie Mtolo. who is determined to be among the first black South Africans since 1904 to compete in the Olympic Games.

Education Minister Louis Pienaar, whose portfolio includes doors sport, said in a statement: "Today is a red-letter day. .. the doors to the readmission of South African sport to international competition have swung open."

But radical anti-apartheid activists denounced the decision by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) in Lausanne and vowed to overturn it.

Joe Ebrahim, President of the South African Council on Sport (SACOS), said IOC President Juan Antonio Samaranch was wrong to readmit South Africa.

"We are going to do whatever we can to show the IOC that to carry through this decision would not be in the best interests of the South African people," he said. Ebrahim said SACOS, which

mainly represents sportsmen aligned with the pact, would oppose all forms of South African participation in the Barcelona Games next year. South African National

Olympic Committee director Doep Du Plessis said the decision would revitalise sport and contribute to racial harmony in a country torn apart by factional violence.
