

# KCC employees working in houses of bureaucrats

**KHULNA, July 18:** A white paper published here Tuesday by the Mayor of Khulna City Corporation Sk. Tayebur Rahman described the condition of the most city roads and drains as inadequate and unfit for traffic movement.

The white paper also mentioned some irregularities and faults regarding construction of drains and maintenance and repairs of some city roads.

The white paper also mentioned water supply as inadequate and said that only 33 per cent of the requirements of the city dwellers are met with the existing water supply system of the corporation.

The white paper also alleged that 21 workers of the

corporation were working at the residences of the Divisional Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner and some Influential Ward Commissioners of the city corporation while day-to-day affairs and development works of the Corporation were suffering seriously due to shortage of manpower.

A total of 1,062 officers and staff are working in various departments. Of whom 327 on ad-hoc basis and master roll against 1290 sanctioned posts.

The white paper described the ad-hoc and master roll appointments as unjust and immoral as the people were serving in the same position for long without permanent appointments. The white paper also demanded immediate appointments to the vacant positions.

The white paper said that 18 class one posts against 29, seven second class posts against 13 are lying vacant. A total of 142 posts of third class

employees and 141 posts of 4th class employees are also lying vacant while 279 master roll employees were working against 199 sanctioned posts.

The white paper also alleged that many of the employees and master roll workers became too old to work but did not mention that how and why they could continue their jobs.

The white paper also hinted gross anomalies in maintaining demand registers of the tax collecting department but however no specific charges against anybody was mentioned.

Regarding imposition of holding taxes the white paper said that Taka 33,43,40,750 crore were imposed as holding tax in 88-89 but subsequently the corporation received 14,028 review petitions to reduce the holding tax. Of which 13,163 cases were resolved and the rest 865 petitions would also be resolved soon. But the white paper did not mention regarding how much money the tax payers were exempted or what amount of money have been finally fixed as yearly holding taxes of the 29,745 holdings.

The white paper alleged that the Khulna armed police battalion has been forcibly occupying 7.60 acres of land at Khalishpur industrial area. The paper said that the City Corporation was planning to set up a park there.

The white paper demanded on first class magistrate and a contingent of police at the disposal of the corporation to help the revenue department in collecting revenue and taxes timely.

# 8,27,858 tons of fertilizers exported in three years

Bangladesh exported 827,858 tons of fertilizers in the last three years to eight countries. Industries Minister Shamsul Islam Khan informed the Jatiya Sangsad Thursday, reports BSS.

Replying to a question from independent member Nurul Islam Khan, he said of the total exports, 5000 tons was TSP, which was exported to Nepal, and the remaining fertilizer comprised Urea nearly half (40,045 tons) of the total exports were done in 1988-89 rpt 1988-89.

Khan said last year, the Taka 136 crore 80 lakh 68 thousand was earned through exports of 290,078 tons, including 5000 tons of TSP.

Besides, Nepal, the countries where fertilizers were exported included China, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam. China with 258,384 tons topped the list of fertilizer importers followed by Nepal (188,271 tons). The other major importers are Sri Lanka (176,417 tons) and Vietnam (92,033 tons).

Replying to a supplementary from BNP member, Dr A Mayeen Khan the Industries Minister said it will take from 3 to 4 months to ascertain whether production at the Ghorasal Fertilizer Factory could be restored to its previous position. He said the actual cause of the accident would be known when the enquiry report on the factory's recent accident would be available within a day or two.

He said the accident at Ghorasal Factory would have great impact on the overall production of fertilizer as well as the export position.

**Unprofitable industries to be disinvested**

Industries Minister Shamsul Islam Khan Thursday informed the House that three state-run corporations incurred a loss of about Tk 88.56 crore in fiscal 1989-90, reports UNB.

He was replying to a question from Salahuddin Kader Chowdhury of National Democratic Party in the House.

Khan said Bangladesh Chemical Industries Corporation (BCIC) sustained a loss of about Tk 30 crore, Bangladesh Sugar and Food Industries Corporation about Tk 7 crore and Bangladesh Steel and Engineering Corporation about Tk 52 crore during the period.

He said the government has plan to disinvest unprofitable industrial units in the public sector phase wise.

In reply to Nurul Islam Khan (Ind), Khan said the investment target in industrial sector achieved 58 per cent during the third five year plan. The investment target was set at 5 thousand 8 hundred crore taka, but 57.89 per cent was achieved during the plan period.

In reply to a separate question from Prof Rafiqul Islam of Awami League, the minister said that the country exported urea fertilizer worth about Tk 137 crore in 1990.

# Bail petition of Mosharraf rejected

Bail petition of former Industries Secretary A K M Mosharraf Hossain was rejected Thursday by a Division Bench of the High Court Division, reports BSS.

The court comprised Justice Mohammad Ismail Uddin Sarker and Justice Kazi Shafuluddin.

Earlier, the bail petition of Mosharraf Hossain was rejected by the Divisional Special Judge's Court, Dhaka.

# Editors' Council polls schedule

The Election Commission constituted by the Bangladesh Council Editors' in its first meeting Thursday announced the election schedule, reports UNB.

Chaired by Director General Press Institute of Bangladesh (PIB) Enamul Haq, the meeting was attended by members Anwarul Islam, Editor, Dainik Desh and Hemayetunnain Ahmed, Editor, the Morning Sun.

The last day for filing nomination papers for election to 18 posts of the executive committee of the Council is August 10.

Scrutiny of nomination papers will be held on August 11 and last day for withdrawal is August 15.

Polling will be held on August 18 from 3 pm to 6 pm through secret ballot at the PIB, said a press release.

The Executive Committee shall be elected for a term of 2 years as provided in the constitution of the Bangladesh Council of Editors.

# BCL sweeps Ctg Medical College union election

# Call to resist conspiracy against freedom fighters

The Central Command Council of Bangladesh Muktdjoddah Sangsad on Thursday alleged that a vested quarter was hatching conspiracy against the freedom fighters of the country.

The motive of the quarter was to reestablish the past committee formed during the autocratic Ershad government. Leaders of the council was addressing a press conference Thursday at Jatiya Press Club where Secretary General of the council MA Abdul Aziz read out a written statement.

President of the council Principal Abdul Ahad Chowdhury urged the people to dispel the confusion about the groupings inside the Sangsad and to resist attempts by some quarters trying to create division among the freedom fighters.

He stated that autocratic Ershad committee was trying to come back in the freedom fighters organisation changing its colour and chanting the slogan of BNP.

He however, said that no section of present government was involved in this conspiracy as the government extended its helping hand to the present Command Council and police had been posted to keep the values of the Sangsad safe.

He further claimed that national councilors elected Ahad-Aziz panel, through the election held in March.

In the election Huda-Nasir Uddin and Mahfuz Amin Sarwar panel participated. He said adding that Mahfuz and Amin Sarwar are now engaged in conspiracy against the elected Central Command Council.

Violating the court verdict the defeated panel was still hatching a conspiracy to destroy the elected council, he alleged.

Before the press conference, the Muktdjoddah Sangsad held a rally in front of the press club in which they urged all the freedom fighters to be united to resist the alleged conspiracy.

Speakers of the Sangsad at

the rally presided over by former council President Abdul Matin Chowdhury, said they, if necessary, would call a grand rally of the freedom fighters.

Central Command Council members Manirul Haq Manir, Shamsur Rahman, Kabir Hossain Bhuiyan, Kamrul Morshed Khokon and Md Anwar Hossain were, among others, present at the conference.
