# Killer medicines on sale

A physician bought a phial of ampicillin, an anti-biotic drug from a pharmacy at Rampura in the city recently. It was powder for paediatric use. The manufacturer of this

pharmaceutical firm. To his utter shock and surprise, the physician saw the ampicillin powder packed in a small amber glass bottle contains chips of blackish stones. The crystal powder of socalled ampicillin was securely packed in the sealed bottle within a carton. All the necessary details about weight. price, manufacturing and expiry dates of the drug are clearly printed both on the label of the bottle and on the carton. The preparation of the syrup with the powder is also stated. But the batch number of the medicine is quite ineli-

essential medicine is a local

The impure ampicillin powder was produced in July. 1989 and its expiry time was July 1992. The medicine is most commonly used for a variety of ailments. There is no doubt a village quack would have administered this contaminated medicine to a child without hesitation. It could not be gathered as to how many phials of this ampicillin powder have been sold in the market. The pharmacist at Rampura procured the item from Mitford drug market.

Another 500 ml glucose injection bought from wholesale drug market at Mitford by a compounder is full of white fungus. The compounder who bought the dextrose injection recently discovered the fungus while preparing to push it into a patient. The injection was produced by the Institute of Public Health in Dhaka last

The Public Health Institute is a government organisation and the glucose injection produced here is primarily meant for use in the country's hospitals and health complexes run by the government, an official source told The Daily Star. With regard to the presence of fungus in the injection the official viewed that long period of storage in an improper situation might be the reason for such 'deposit'. This preparation is injected to a patient intravenously. If administered,



unscrupulous traders. The medicines which were banned under drug policy by the government of ousted President Ershad eight years ago have good market. The banned medicines once produced locally by the multinational and some big firms had maintained high standard. But the same items now entering the country from across the border or manufactured by clandestine factories have very poor quality. Because of their popularity these items are being sold on a largescale, some drug dealers told The Daily Star. Thus the consumers are deceived, they added. The health authorities are

hard put to control the sale of fake and sub-standard drugs in the absence of adequate staff and required facilities. At present about 25 thousand drug stores are operating in the country with licences. Of these about 8000 are located in Dhaka. But the number of unlicensed pharmacies will be well over one lakh. In addition, thousands of quacks are engaged in selling all types of medicines in country's hats and bazars. The health department has only 20 drug inspectors to collect samples of drugs from the shops and also inspect 195 registered pharmaceutical plants spread over the country. Thus this is an almost impossible task for them to survey all the shops and factories to determine the quality of the drugs and control sale of imported ones. As a result most of the drugs are sold without detection.

In the event of a sample collection, the task is not easy to determine its quality and efficacy. The sample is sent to the Drug Testing Laboratory at Mohakhali, the lone of its kind in Bangladesh. There the sample awaits testing for months as the laboratory has multifarious other important jobs to perform with the limited staff, inadequate equip ment and lack of necessary

They said that the BCL (S-A) gave sanctuary to Dr Milon's murderer and other armed outsiders on the campus to do vandalism. During the past several days the armed outsiders and the BCL (S-A) activists attacked JCD activists and drove them out of S M Hall, Zahurul Hug Hall and Jagannath Hall. They also ransacked several rooms of those halls, the JCD and DUCSU leaders alleged.

The BCL workers burnt several vehicles and created panic on the campus threatened the S M Hall Provost and ransacked his office on July 16 protesting police search of the hall for suspected killers of Dr.

Milon, they said. They also threatened the Provost of Zaharul Hug Hall the JCD leaders alleged and said both the provosts have resigned to protest the incidents. Their intra-party conflict also terrorised the campus on Thursday, they said.

Presided over by BFUJ President Reazuddin Ahmed, the rally was addressed by BFUJ Secretary General Amanullah Kabir, DUJ President Zahirul Haq, General Secretary Ruhul Amin Gazi, President of Press Workers Federation Mosharraf Hossain Vice President Fazle Iman and General Secretary Bazlur Rahman Milon, President of Newspaper Employees Federation Jahangir Kabir, and General Secretary Mir Mozammel Hossain.

A token strike for three hours from 11 am to 2 pm was observed in all newspapers and news agencies.

In the resolutions taken at the rally, the leaders retterated their pledge for continu ing an indefinite strike in the five newspapers who, they alleged, were conspiring against the Wage Board and called upon the managements of other newspapers and news agencies to fulfil the demand for increased salary and allowances by July 22.

#### **Baker meets Assad in Damascus**

DAMASCUS, July 18: US Secretary of State James A Baker III met with Syrian President Hafez Assad on Thursday to nail down Syria's acceptance of a US formula for Mideast peace talks. The session was the first step on Baker's latest and most promising venture, designed to set up an Arab-Israeli peace conference. The trip to five countries in four days was prompted by a letter from Assad to US President Bush accepting US proposals for the talks, reports AP.

The tax revenues can be mobilised in ways other than VAT, he said.

The FBCCI came earlier under strong criticism from its affiliated member bodies for its "passive" stand on the VAT-induced problems.

In another development concerning the VAT, Bangladesh Awami League has extended its total support to the Anti-VAT movement by the restive trade and industry. The leaders of the party's city unit exchanged views Thursday with the business representatives at their party office. The Awami League announced its programme to hold a protest rally on July 20 at 4 pm at Bangabandhu Avenue for a total withdrawal of what it alleged 'anti-people' VAT.

Trade and industry circles have meanwhile given detailed accounts of how the VAT would lead to price-hikes and facilitate entry of more smuggled goods. They cited cases of locally produced paper, cellophane paper, electrical goods,

products and a wide array of items covered under it. They strongly refuted the claims of National Board of Revenue (NBR) about minimal price impact of the VAT, terming the 'government propaganda' as one-sided. Meanwhile, the NBR is preparing a new the lists of

VAT registered units, keeping in view the exemptions of about 20 items and services announced by Finance and Planning Minister Saifur Rahman on July 10 before the approval of the VAT bill by the Jatiya Sangsad amid walk-out by the opposition. Earlier, over ten thousand units were registered under VAT rules by the

The VAT has been introduced by the government as the key element of its tax reform aimed at widening the tax base without raising the tax rates, plug tax evasion and enforce a uniform tax rate by replacing the hitherto existing multiple rates for sales tax at import stage and excise duty on manufacturing and in services sectors.

Over 80 countries in the world, including those in the third world and the least developed, have already introduced VAT. The VAT rates at introduction stage in most developing countries varied between five per cent and 12 per cent, according to knowledge-

able circles. The same circles pointed out that the successful implementation of VAT as a modern taxation system for avoiding tax cascading (tax on taxes) effects depends mainly on effective preparations. Though VAT has been under consideration in Bangladesh for the last three years, no serious efforts have so far been made to let the potential VAT-payers as well as the VAT-collectors know its operational aspects

A former chief of a chamber body said that the NBR should have consulted the representatives of trade and industry in details to win the confidence of the business community before the final decision for its introduction. No dialogue was held during the last six months because of the political turmoil, the Gulf crisis, the elections and the cyclone, he
