Saudi emissary meets Foreign Minister

Common approach to Gulf security plan discussed

Foreign Minister ASM Mostafizur Rahman and the Special Envoy of his Saudi counterpart Prince Saud Al-Faisal on Sunday discussed matters of mutual interests, especially the agenda of the forthcoming Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers (ICFM), reports UNB.

Mostafiz will lead a four-member delegation at the conference due in Istanbul, Turkey, on August 3-8.

Assistant Deputy Foreign Minister for Political Affairs of Saudi Arabia Ismail Al-Shura,

who arrived here on Saturday night on a one day visit, called on the Foreign Ministers at his office Sunday morning.

Officials said they exchanged views on the possibility of taking common approach by the Muslim countries in the ensuing ICFM on various problems facing them.

The two leaders mainly discussed the possible ways to stop the recurrence of aggression of one country by another, in the backdrop of occupation of Kuwait by its militarily more powerful neighbour Iraq in last

August.

The talks also dealt on different striking issues, including the Gulf crisis and its aftermath, middle-east problems, the security in the Gulf and "nuclear arms free zone."

The Foreign Minister and the Saudi Envoy expressed keen interest in coordinating the policies of the two brotherly countries in Istanbul conference for promoting unity and solidarity of the Muslim Ummah.

Mostafiz renewed his gratitude to the Kingdom for its assistance to the cyclone victims and also for the reconstruction and the rehabilitation programmes in the calamity-prone coastal belt of the country.

Ismail recalled the visit of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia to the Gulf countries including Saudi Arabia which, he said, contributed to further strengthening the solidarity and the fraternity of the Muslim Ummah.

Foreign Secretary Abul Ahsan and Director General (West Asia) A K Fazlur Rahman were present on the occasion.

The Special Envoy delivered a message from Saudi Foreign Minister to Mostafiz.

The Special Envoy who flew in here from Islamabad left for Malaysia from where he will proceed to Indonesia and Brunei Darussalam.

DMC inherits Tk 138cr debt

City Mayor Mirza Abbas said due to corrupt practices by the past government, Dhaka Municipal Corporation (DMC) inherited a burden of Taka 138 crore in debt when the autocratic government stepped down, reports BSS.

He said when power was snatched away from BNP in 1982, the DMC had a surplus fund of Taka 66 crore.

He was speaking at the biennial conference of Kotwali Thana Unit of Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) held at the Siddique Bazar Community Centre in the old city.

Among others, State Minister for Sports and Youth, Sadek Hossain Khoka, General Secretary of Kotwali Thana Unit of BNP, Abu Mohamad Mainuddin, Vice-President M Shahjahan, and former Chairman of Ward No 33 Advocate Yakub Ali.

Kotwali Thana BNP President Alhaj M Siraj Presided.

Mirza Abbas expressed the hope that it would be possible to overcome the burden within one year by increasing income through stopping corrupt practices.

Quoting an example, he said this year Taka 46 lakh was earned against Taka 22 lakh last year by leasing out the cattle markets in the DMC area during Eid-ul Azha. He said this was possible as the markets were leased out this time through proper tender instead of yielding to any pressure or negotiations.

Urging the city dwellers to clear their municipal taxes, Mirza Abbas said if the tax payers were sincere in their statements, they would not be losers. He said adequate provisions were there to make justice to them.

He asked the tax payees not to bribe any officer or employee of the DMC and said if any one in the DMC could be found indulging in corrupt practices, strong action would be taken against him.

Referring to the alleged conspiracies hatched by some political party to unseat the government, he said BNP would resist it by all means. He urged the workers to remain vigilant and prepared to face any danger that might come. He alleged that Awami League was encouraging terrorism and creating violence on the campus to discredit the government.

Sadek Hossain Khoka urged the guardians to come forward in maintaining congenial atmosphere in the society. He said
