Dhaka Day by Day Sun and Wheel

Pale, subdued hues, shadows of figures and Wakefield done in Yorkshire and Bratton Lake messages hidden within messages characterise the works of Shamsul Islam Nizami in his fifth solo exhibition held at La Galerie in Banani. Nizami's quiet, pensive mood is captured in all his works, whether it is in a clear, simple painting of storks looking for fish ('seeking') or a complicated composition made of clay and stone. There is no overt violence or anger in any of his works. Even paintings such as the one depicting the terrifying twirl of the recent cyclonic storm has a deathlike quietude. Another painting based on this terrible catastrophe shows the figure of an old man emotionally and physically fatigued by the storm, his weariness and misery reflected in his aimless walk.

The theme of this exhibition is 'Sun and world upon reaching adulthood. Wheel' and this is reflected through the wheel like structures and the pale crimson colouring in many of the paintings. The sun is the source of life and the wheel represents the life force. One very interesting piece 'The East' shows a saffron coloured wheellike structure resembling a weather cock. The background shows distant hills fading into the horizon while a shy sun hides behind a veil of grey clouds, hovering over the

Parts of the wheel seems to have broken zami's intense soul searching, his desire to off giving the impression of its being not alto- comprehend the world on both real and philogether complete.
