

DUCSU call to expel armed elements of BCL from varsity

Mujib's death anniversary: AL's nine-day programme

Awami League has chalked out a nine-day programme beginning from August 10 in observance of the 16th anniversary of death of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

Discussions on Bangabandhu will be held by the party and its front organisations from August 10 to August 13. A blood donation programme has been organised by Bangabandhu Parishad, on August 14.

On August 15, the day of Bangabandhu's killing, black flags would be hoisted atop all AL offices in the country and the Bangabandhu Bhaban at Dhanmondi in the city. National flag will fly at half-mast and leaders and workers will wear black-badges. Bangabandhu's portrait will be garlanded and fateha will be offered at his mazar. Milad will be held. Desistments will be held at Bangabandhu Bhaban at noon.

A public meeting will be held at Panthapath in the city on August 16.

Programme on other days include holding of cultural programmes by various cultural groups.

The dacoits Jasmuddin and Shawkat Osman confessed that they belonged to a group of inter-district dacoits and that they had committed several dacoities on Chittagong-Dhaka Highway, Chittagong Cox's Bazar road, besides Satkania, Cox's Bazar, Feni Hathazari, Sitakunda and other places.

Brief cases, wrist watches, etc, were among the recovered articles. They also confessed that they committed dacoities with fire arms, the police said.

8 Islamic centres to be built in cyclone-battered areas

Muslim Aid, a UK based organisation will set up eight Islamic centres in cyclone hit areas of the country.

Representatives of Muslim Aid (UK) Suleman Yousuf Tula and Golam Ahmed Manayar told this Thursday at a press conference at Jatiya Press Club.

They said these centres will teach Islamic education in a planned way. The construction work of two centres has already been started in Chittagong cyclone-battered areas, they added.

With the assistance of Islamic Centre, Bangladesh, the Muslim Aid will also establish 200 educational institutions including madrasas and mosques in the affected upazilas and districts, they said, adding a total of 50 thousand pound equivalent to Taka 28 lakhs will be needed for the programme.

Referring to their visit to the affected areas, representatives of the Aid said that they distributed 150 tons goods including blanket, children's clothes and food and Taka six thousand in cash among the distressed people.

The representatives also informed that an elaborate programme including rehabilitation activities would be taken up by the Muslim Aid (UK) on the basis of their report to be submitted to the authorities.

Representatives from Islamic Centre Bangladesh were also present at the press conference.

Mahmudur Rahman made National Professor

The government has appointed Major General Dr. Mahmudur Rahman Chowdhury National Professor for a period of five years in recognition to his contribution in his professional services, an official announcement said in Dhaka Thursday night, reports BSS.

An eminent physician Dr. Chowdhury, who joined the armed forces in 1952, has been serving as commandant of the Armed Forces' Pathology Institute at Dhaka cantonment since 1973.

Born on July 1, 1928 Chowdhury obtained his MBBS from Calcutta, MRCP (Path) from London, and FCPS and FAS from Dhaka University. Chowdhury held important posts in WHO, Dhaka University, Science Academy, Bangladesh Aids Committee and many other important organisations.

He wrote a text book on Micro-Biology and over 40 of his research papers were published in many science and medical journals at home and abroad.

Widely travelled Chowdhury, attended many international seminar, symposium, conference and workshops relating to professional matters.

For his outstanding contributions in medical science, Chowdhury was honoured with Independence Day Award. He also received TQA (Pakistan) and Chief of Armed Forces' Certificate.
