Rallies condemn attack on Khabar workers

The leaders of three federations in the newspaper industry demanded immediate implementation of the Fourth Wage Board Award in all the newspapers and news agencies. The leaders thanked the management of the newspapers and news agencies where steps have already been taken to implement the award.

Addressing the two rallies of journalists and newspaper employees in front of the Ittefaq and the Khabar Monday, the leaders said that the atmosphere of peace and understanding would prevail if the owners of other newspapers come forward to ensure minimum salary and allowances for journalists, employees and press workers according to law.

President of Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalist (BFUJ) Rezauddin Ahmed presided over a rally while the other rally was chaired by Zahurul Haque, President of Dhaka Union of Journalist (DUJ). The rallies condemned the attack on journalists and employees of the Khabar by the hooligans engaged by the management of the daily.

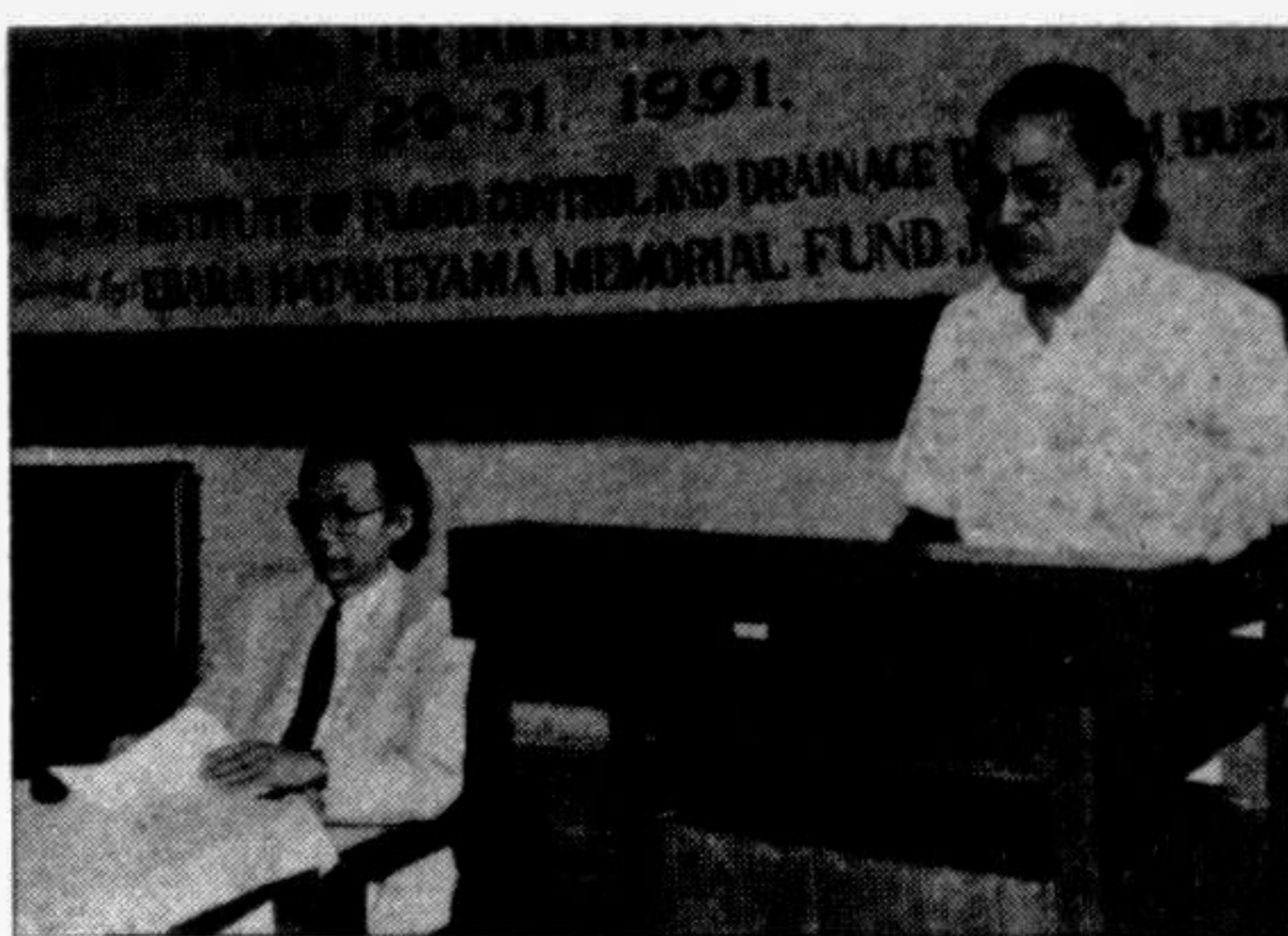
The rallies asked the Khabar management to apologise unconditionally for the incident and accept demands of the journalists and employees. The leaders also called upon the Ittefaq management to solve the problem through discussions and said that the consequences of threats and conspiracies can never be good.

The rallies were addressed among others by BPUJ Secretary General Amanullah Kabir, DUJ General Secretary and Joint Secretary Ruhul Amin Gazi and M A Aziz respectively. Press Workers Federation President, Secretary General and Vice-President Mosharrar Hossain, Bazar Rahman Milon and Fazle Imam respectively, Employees Federation President and Secretary General Jahangir Kabir and Mir Mosharrar Hossain respectively and Bangladesh Road Transport Workers Union President Sadour Rahman Hiru.

Meanwhile, the management of the Dainik Shakti of Dhaka and the Dainik Jahan of Mymensingh have decided to implement Fourth Wage Board Award. The journalists and employees of the newspapers have withdrawn their strike and resumed work, says press release.

Education system faces critical condition

Minister for Education and Cultural Affairs Prof A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury said the country's education system has been facing a critical condition created by the last autocratic government and erosion of moral values in the society, reports BSS.

It is now high time for the people to think over the matter and solve the problem untied in the greater national interests, he added. The minister was speaking as chief guest at the "modernization of business studies courses in the government commercial institutions in Bangladesh" held in Dhaka Monday.

The Education and Cultural Secretary, ANM Eusuf, the function, was addressed by State Minister for Education Prof A Q M Eunos Khan, Secretary of the ministry, Ahmed Hossain and Director General of the Secondary and Higher Education Mozammel Haq and UNESCO expert Robert Burton.

The Education and Cultural Affairs Minister said the BNP government is quite aware of the problems of the education sector and it has already allocated maximum fund for modernization of education system on realisation of the needs of the people. He added that business studies have become an important branch of education to meet the demand of the increasing trade and commerce.

Prof B Chowdhury said the commercial education was made a tremendous progress in the present world due to application of science and technology. The commercial education should be re-designed to cater to the needs of the day and brilliant teachers should be attracted to this education for this purpose, he added.

State Minister for Education in his address said the government has already drawn up a plan to modernise and spread education among the people. He also laid stress on continuous training, evaluation of performance and modernisation of syllabus and curriculum of the commercial education for making it dynamic and appropriate for the country.

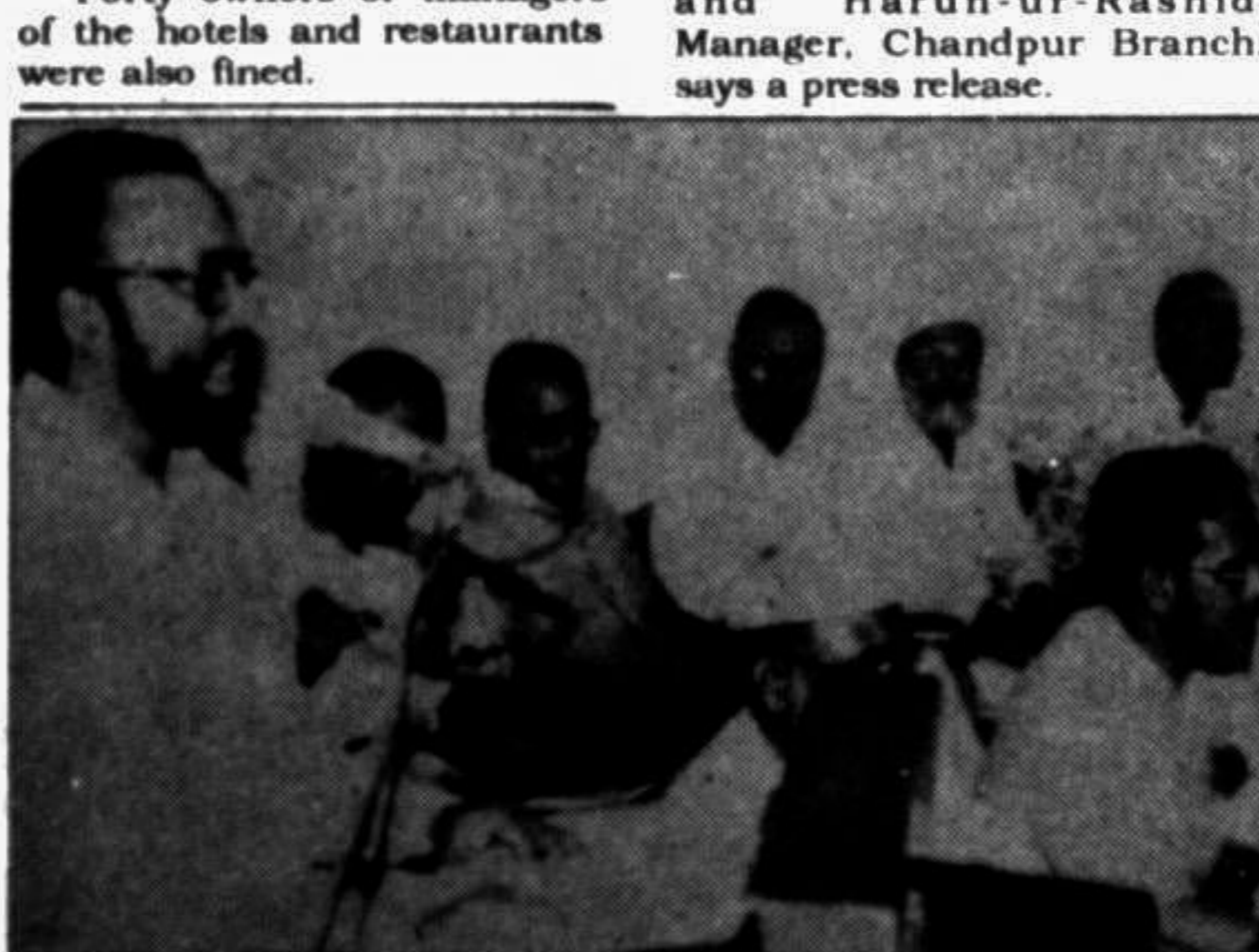

In a statement on Monday the AL chief said that Abu Bakar had struggled till death to establish the rights of the poor. With his death the country lost an honest and promising political leader.

AL General Secretary Sajeda Chowdhury and Asstt. Office Secretary KM Jahangir also condoled the death of Abu Bakar.

One killed over a 'bidi'

From Our Correspondent NARAYANGANJ, July 29: A young man strangled his father-in-law on Sunday at Ramnagar hat village of Raipur following a brawl between the father-in-law and the brother of the victim. The victim Mahamud Ali (40) and his brother Abdul Ali had a quarrel over the sharing of a "bidi". At one point Akkas Ali (25), the son-in-law arrived on the spot and took side of Abdul Ali. Akkas became agitated and strangled his father-in-law.

Abul Hossein dead. UNB adds: Abul Hossain, Chief Whip of erstwhile East Pakistan Assembly, died of cerebral hemorrhage Saturday at his village home in Taraganj upazila. He was 85.

Hossain was also the Political Secretary to the then chief Minister Abu Hossain Sarkar. He was buried at his family graveyard. The veteran politician left behind two sons and four daughters.

M A Karim dead. M A Karim, former Executive President Islami Bank Bangladesh and Managing Director of Bangladesh Shilpa Bank (BSB) expired Monday following a massive heart attack, reports UNB.

He was 64. He was suffering from diabetes and whooping cough. He was buried after Asr prayer at the New Azimpur graveyard. His Qui Khawani will be held on Thursday (August 1) after Asr prayer at his 13/C, 9/C Babar Road, Mohammadpur residence.

B A Siddiky hospitalised

BA Siddiky, former Chief Justice of the then East Pakistan, was admitted to the Holy Family Red Crescent Hospital with lung and kidney complications on Friday, family sources said Monday, reports BSS.
