It initiative urged to solve newspapers problems

The prevailing situation in the newspaper industry, including the non-publication of three Metropolitan Bengali dailies for about two weeks, was raised in the Jatiya Sangsad Tuesday morning, reports BSS.

The Deputy Leader of the House, Prof. Badruddoza Chowdhury told the House that certain developments had taken place recently in the newspaper industry on which the State Minister for Information would make a statement to apprise the House of the overall situation.

Earlier, opposition Ganatantri Party member Suranjit Sengupta drew the attention of the Speaker, Abdur Rahman Biswas, to the state of affairs in the newspaper industry and said some important newspapers like 'The Ittefaq', 'The Sangbad' and 'The Khabar' were not being published for quite some time.

Sengupta said the proceedings of the House were carried by those important dailies to the people in different constituencies. He urged the government to take steps in this regard.

Later, during the evening sitting BAKSAL member Abdur Razzak, while taking part in the debate on the 11th Constitutional amendment bill, referred to the situation in those newspapers and said the owners, journalists, employees and the government had the responsibility to promote democracy. Therefore, he urged them to take joint initiative to solve the problems in those dailies.

Earlier, opposition Jatiya Party member Manirul Haq Chowdhury also demanded a statement from the State Minister for Information about alleged stoppage of advertisements to 'The Daily Janata'.

By stopping advertisement to the Janata, the government was curbing freedom of the press, he said and added that such an act was contrary to the constitutional provisions and designed to suppress freedom of the press.

The publication of the three dailies, 'The Ittefaq', 'The Sangbad' and 'The Khabar' remained suspended since July 18 following an indefinite strike by the journalists and the employees of those organisations to press their demand for enhanced salary and better facilities and to protest the conspiracy against the Wage Board.

No headway yet in population control

Dhaka assigned to prepare three SAARC health projects

The 9th meeting of the SAARC Technical Committee on Health and Population Activities which ended in Dhaka on Tuesday has decided to develop and implement some target-oriented and time-bound projects for immediate benefit of the people of the region, reports UNB.

Some such projects would be in the areas of Primary Health Care, Tuberculosis and Leprosy, Water and Sanitation, and Nutrition of Children.

Briefing newsmen about the decisions, Health and Family Welfare Secretary M. Mokammel Haque who chaired the three-day meeting termed the deliberations 'successful' and the decisions 'significant'.

He said that Bangladesh will prepare projects on the first three subjects while Sri Lanka will work on Nutrition of Children.

Matiur Rahman, Joint Secretary at the Health Ministry, Qamar Rahim, Secretary of the SAARC Secretariat and Dr Siddiqui, Director General of Health Services were present at the briefing.

The Technical Committee prepared a draft plan of Action on Children for consideration of the next SAARC summit to be held in Male.

It also considered a revised proposal by Nepal for setting up a SAARC Tuberculosis Centre in that country on an emergency basis.

Pakistan will be the focal point for coordination of networking arrangement in malaria, now on the rise in the region. Individual countries will submit information relating to their own.

Bangladesh had submitted a status paper on harmonization of national laws and other member countries of the seven-nation regional forum have been asked to do the same. Harmonization will be initially sought in priority areas like safe drinking water, purity of food, smoking in public, legal age of marriage and breast milk substitute.

"SAARC will have to gear up its population programmes because little has been achieved so far in this area", said Mokammel Haque, the current chairman of the technical committee.

A workshop on population policy will be held in October this year in India, he informed. It has been decided that the country status papers on drug policy, list of essential medicines, welfare of the handicapped, family welfare and programme on children welfare would be updated and submitted to the SAARC Secretariat.

Mahila Parishad concern over price hike of essentials

Aysha Khanam condemned the Mahila Sangstha Bill which was adopted in the parliament recently.

Demand for removal of CU VC continues

CHITTAGONG, July 30 : Movement of the Shibir backed student bodies in the Chittagong University for implementation of inquiry commission report and removal of the Vice-Chancellor continued while the 15-day deadline by Acting President for restoration of normalcy expires today (Wednesday).

Sangrami Chhatra Oikya staged sit-in-strike in front of the Vice Chancellor's office for the 10th consecutive day, Tuesday as a result, Prof Alamgir Mohammad Strajuddin, Vice Chancellor of the university could not attend his office.

Sammlita Chhatra Oikya Parishad also staged demonstration and held a rally Tuesday at the campus premises demanding implementation of the report and removal of the Vice Chancellor.

Meanwhile, classes were held with thin attendance of students for the last few days. It appeared that most of the students were waiting for Acting President's measures to be adopted for the restoration of normalcy after the expiry of 15-day-deadline.

Tea shipment to Iran to be delayed
Another report adds: The weekly tea sale held here today was almost dull as buyers for the USSR and Iran operated selectively causing a fair withdrawal, market sources said.

Internal buyers were also less active.

Market sources indicated that next shipment to Iran could be delayed because of late arrival of vessel and as such the Iranian buyers were selective in buying tea.

Bold brokers sold well at firm rates while clean well made types were fully firm to slightly dearer. All other brokers were about steady.

Primary fannings also met with a good demand at around last levels. A selected few were occasional dearer. The best, however, eased slightly.

Four hundred forty-seven chests of green tea were on offer. Stalky plain liquoring types were discounted. Young hyson (special) sold at Taka 67/80 per kg, fine young hyson at Tk 62/82 per kg, hyson at Tk 64 per kg and young hysons sold between Tk 62 and Tk 66/50 per kg.

Poorer young hysons sold between Tk 57/70 and Tk 58/50 per kg. Other plainer types were withdrawn without bids.

About 3,578 chests of dust category on offer met with a fair demand at easier rates with fair withdrawals. Once again internal buyers were the only operators.
