ZAGREB, Aug 3: Croatia's leadership, under attack from armed Serbs and its own ranks, on Saturday rejected a federal truce plan and pledged stronger defence from Serbian

Stipe Mesic, the federal presidency's Croatian chairman, rejected the eight-man body's demand for an *immediate and absolute cease-fire" in the fierce fighting that has killed scores of people since Croatia declared

independence June 25. Mesic said the truce plan was a bid to deter Europeanled peace efforts and criticised the presidency for failing "to name the aggressor, which is Serbia."
