

# No move to bring Ershad to JS: Badruddoza

Tuesday underlined supreme need for the national consensus in the passage of the Constitution Amendment Bills, reports BSS.

He was making a statement in the House in reply to the allegation of Awami League leader Tofael Ahmed that a move was under way to bring former President H M Ershad and three other Jatiya Party leaders, now in jail, to the sangsad on parole for voting on the Constitution Amendment Bills. Tofael also accused the government of trying to rehabilitate deposed President Ershad and Jatiya Party.

Earlier, Law Minister Mirza Gholam Hafiz and Acting leader of the Jatiya Party Parliamentary Party, Moudud Ahmed refuted the allegations of Tofael Ahmed.

Badruddoza Prof Chowdhury, whose speech was often punctuated with repeated applause by the members of the Treasury Bench and those from other groups excepting Awami League and its allies, said none should object if a national consensus was arrived at in the interest of the nation and the politics of the country. In this connection, he pointed out that the Constitution Amendment Bills had been brought to the House reflecting the sentiment and opinion of the people. The MPs of all major parties have been included in the Select Committee to ensure the passage of the Constitution Amendment Bills through consensus, he added
