Giap dropped in cabinet shakeup

BANGKOK, Aug 10: Vo Nguyen Giap-the 'Red Napoleon" who decimated the French at Dien Bien Phufaded from Vietnam's political scene Saturday in a major shakeup of the Cabinet, now headed by a proponent of capitalist-style reform, reports AP.

Also losing his portfolio was Foreign Minister Nguyen Co Thach, a suave diplomat among Hanot's frequently rough-hewn leadership. He had reportedly been criticised for failing to forge diplomatie ties with the United States and for his hardline policies toward China.

As Thach's resignation took effect, Vietnam and China issued a communique saying they wished to normalise relations for the sake of regional peace and stability.

The communique, issued at the end of three days of bilateral talks in Betjing, did not give a timetable for the restoration of normal ties but said consultations would con-

official Voice of Vietnam radio said the Cabinet changes also affected the portfolios of defense, interior. trade, the State Planning Commission and vice chairmanship of the Cabinet.

The widely expected

shakeup was preceded Friday by the election as Prime Minister of Vo Van Kiet, 69, a veteran revolutionary who nonetheless has emerged as the leading advocate of Western style economic re-

"Our economy is shifting from a centralised to a market-oriented one under state control, and is gradually scoring new achievements." Kiet earlier told delegates to the National Assembly session which elected him.

The session has aired a host of problems, ranging from rampant official corruption to unemployment to economic inefficiencies which have kept Vietnams among the poorest of the world's nations.

Analysts in Hanoi and Bangkok believe Kiet's elevation indicates that Vietnam is now firmly set on dismantling much of its centralised econand opening up to the West. It badly wants diplomatic relations with the United States, which has slapped a trade embargo on the country.

But the all-powerful Communist Party has made it 'clear it has no intention of sharing power with any domestic opposition groups.

Sources said that according to the new Rules of Business the secretaries will remain responsible to the concerned ministers and that the Establishment and Cabinet Divisions will be placed under the direct control of the Prime

Minister. According to the Prime

Ministers Secretariat sources an Act will be passed after the formulation of the new Rules of Business.

Under the new Rules of Business the Prime Minister is likely to hold charges of ministries not placed under the charge of any minister.

The framing of the new Rules of Business and allocation of work are likely to be completed by the end of the month and will come into effect just after the authentication of the Constitution Twelfth Amendment Bill by the President, which would require holding of a referen-

After the election of a new president under the amended Constitution the new Rules of Business may come into force.

It is learnt that the Bangabhaban will be the official residence of the president while the present President's Secretariat will be used as the Prime Minister's secretariat.

Fresh floods in six upazilas of Sirajganj

SIRAJGANJ, Aug 10: About 30,000 people have been affected by fresh floods in six upazilas of the district as the Jamuna again went into spate, reports UNB.

The Jamuna has swelled 9 cm here in the last 24 hours. inundating low-lying areas in 75 villages in the Sadar. Kazipur, Raiganj, Belkuchi, Chouhali and Shahjadpur upazilas, the district Flood Control Cell said today.

Two hundred families have been rendered homeless by erosion intensified by the surging waters, Sadar Upazila Chairman Abdul Latif said.

England were firmly in control of the fifth and final Test against the West Indies at the Oval Saturday after having reduced the tourists to 152 for three in their second innings, still another 91 runs behind England's first innings total of 419, according to BBC monitored in Dhaka late last night.

The Caribbeans, who lead the series 2-1, were made to follow on 243 runs behind after being dismissed for 176 in their first innings shortly after lunch on the

third day. West indies collapsed dramatically Saturday in the face of some splendid spin bowling by Phil Tufnell, the Middlesex left-armer who earned six wickets conceding only 25 runs on his Test recall after being overlooked since the Australian tour.

The last nine West Indian wickets fell for the addition of only 86 runs to their overnight score of 90 for

Desmond Haynes carried his bat through the innings, remaining unbeaten on 75, thus becoming the first West Indian to carry his bat in a Test innings

In the second innings, Richie Richardson with 39 and Carl hooper with Il were at the crease at stumps. Haynes made 43, Simmons 36 and debutant Clayton Lambert made 13 -the three batsmen out in the second knock.


