Police is awaiting the postmortem report to file a murder case on the death of the housewife, who was allegedly strangulated and pushed out of the roof of a five-storey building in Maghbazar on Saturday.

An unnatural death (UD) case was registered with the Ramna police in this connection. The body of Dolly (22) was taken to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital for post-mortem examinations. Meanwhile, police is look-

ing for the husband, ismail Hussain, and his room-mate who were both present on the rooftop before the incident happened. Police said they are both absconding.

Earlier, the body of Dolly was found hanging from a hook at the maingate of the building late Saturday night.

Dolly used to live in Narayangoni while her husband, a car driver in the city. lived in a room at the roof of the building in Maghbazar.


