

Police awaiting post-mortem report on Dolly's death

Police is awaiting the post-mortem report to file a murder case on the death of the housewife, who was allegedly strangled and pushed out of the roof of a five-storey building in Maghbazar on Saturday. An unnatural death (UD) case was registered with the Ramna police in this connection. The body of Dolly (22) was taken to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital for post-mortem examinations. Meanwhile, police is looking for the husband, Ismail Hussain, and his room-mate who were both present on the rooftop before the incident happened. Police said they are both absconding. Earlier, the body of Dolly was found hanging from a hook at the main gate of the building late Saturday night. Dolly used to live in Narayangonj while her husband, a car driver in the city, lived in a room at the roof of the building in Maghbazar.

70,754 to appear at Rajshahi HSC exams

A total of 70,754 students from 260 colleges will appear at the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examination '91 beginning on August 22 under Rajshahi Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board, reports BSS.

Of the total candidates, 53,707 are male students and 17,047 are female students.

38,720 students will appear at the HSC examination from humanities group while 20,535 from science group and 11,499 from commerce group. Of them 70,082 are regular students and 672 are irregular students.

The HSC examination will be held in 148 centres under Rajshahi Education Board. Meanwhile, arrangements are being taken to send necessary papers to the examination centres.

NAP (Bhasani) leader sick

Nizamul Haq, a secretariat member of Bangladesh National Awami Party (Bhasani), has been admitted to a city clinic with serious ailment, reports BSS.

Haq, a close associate of Moulana Bhasani, solicited help from the countrymen for his early recovery.

Mustafiz, Belayati talk Islamic Common Market

The idea of an Islamic Common Market figured in the official talks between Bangladesh and Iran was held in Teheran on Saturday with Iranian Foreign Minister Dr Ali Akbar Belayati and Bangladesh Foreign Minister ASM Mostafizur Rahman leading their respective sides, according to a report received in Dhaka, says BSS.

During the meeting, Mostafizur Rahman said the present government under the leadership of Begum Khaleda Zia would follow the policies and guidelines of late President Ziaur Rahman who worked relentlessly for the cause of unity of the Islamic Ummah.

The Bangladesh Foreign Minister suggested that an Islamic Common Market might be created to facilitate exchange of goods and services for the benefit of the Islamic Ummah. A re-insurance scheme under the auspices of OIC would protect business

and assets of the Islamic countries, he added.

The Iranian Foreign Minister reciprocating the views of Bangladesh Foreign Minister said that Iran was also keenly interested in adopting all measures for improving relations with Islamic countries.

Earlier, on arrival yesterday morning, Mostafizur Rahman was received by Iranian Foreign Minister Dr Ali Akbar Belayati.

On bilateral matters, Rahman said that Bangladesh as the second largest Muslim country of the world could help Iran in its reconstruction and development efforts by supporting with skilled and semi-skilled manpower in sectors like manufacturing, construction, farming, animal husbandry and fishing. He said that proposed air services agreement between the two countries would pave the way for further trade exchange.

Rahman urged his Iranian counterpart to use his good of-

ices so that the Bangladeshi nationals, who had been working in Iran without legal status, could stay and work in this country.

The Iranian Foreign Minister said Iran would continue to endeavour to further improve bilateral relations in all sectors.

The Bangladesh Foreign Minister also called on the Iranian Commerce Minister, Abdul Hossain Vahaj.

JSD (Rab) demands professionals' representation in parliament

RAJSHAHI, Aug 11: One person was killed and 20 others were injured when a minibus collided with a train at Belpukur crossing, 20 km off from the city, late Saturday.

The deceased was identified as Babar Lal (34) of Puthia upazila.

Out of the 20 injured four have been admitted to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital, police sources said. Most of the injured were passenger of minibus. One of the injured passengers said that the gate of the crossing was not shut and the minibus was fast moving.

'Journalists have a great role to play in parliamentary form'

CHITTAGONG Aug 11: State Minister for Forest, Fisheries and Environment, Abdullah Al-Noman, today said that national press could play a vital role in perpetuating the democratic process now set in motion in the country, reports BSS.

He pointed out that a greater and more important responsibility now developed on the journalist community with the switching over to parliamentary form of government.

Speaking as chief guest at the eighth foundation anniversary celebration function of the Weekly Ittehad at the Ziaul Parshad Hall here he said that a constructive role of national press would be a great source of inspiration for giving newly achieved democracy an institutional shape.

The function presided over by eminent neuro-surgeon and editorial adviser of the Weekly Ittehad was addressed by

Chittagong City Corporation Mayor Mir M Nasir Uddin, BNP leader Dr AFM Yusuf, journalist Motinul Alam and Editor of the weekly, Moinuddin Kaderi Shawkat.

The State Minister said that the present government under the dynamic leadership of Begum Khaleda Zia believed in full freedom of the press in consonance with democracy and as such the national press was enjoying unfettered freedom for the first time in the history of the country. We have to keep this tradition alive through mutual respect and understanding and the press could play a vital role in this regard, he added. The BNP government's political pledge is to ensure democratic rights of the people and the press, he added.

He said, newspapers are logically called mirror of the society because the press reflects the views of citizens as

well as national events along with identification of problems and indicating their solution.

Noman also stressed the need for concerted efforts of both the government and the opposition for establishing democracy in the country. We need unanimity in matters of giving democracy and institutional shape, he said.

He commended the role of the weekly Ittehad in upholding democratic principles and hoped that the weekly would continue its constructive role in this respect.
