Smuggled goods worth Tk 5.4 cr seized in Cox's Bazar

COX'S BAZAR, July 16: The Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) personnel seized smuggled goods worth about Taka 5.35 crore from different places of the Cox's Bazar district during the last six months, reports BSS.

A total of 93 smugglers were arrested in this connection.

According to a BDR sources, goods worth Taka 4,77,76,000 were seized while being smuggled into Bangladesh from Burma while goods valued at Taka 56,88,000 were seized while being smuggled out of the country.

The smuggled goods included medicines, cosmetics, lock, fishing net, cigarette, wood silver, baby food, cloth, dry chillies, crockeries and wine.

A total of 571 cases out of which 29 claimed and 543 unclaimed were filed with different police stations in this connection.

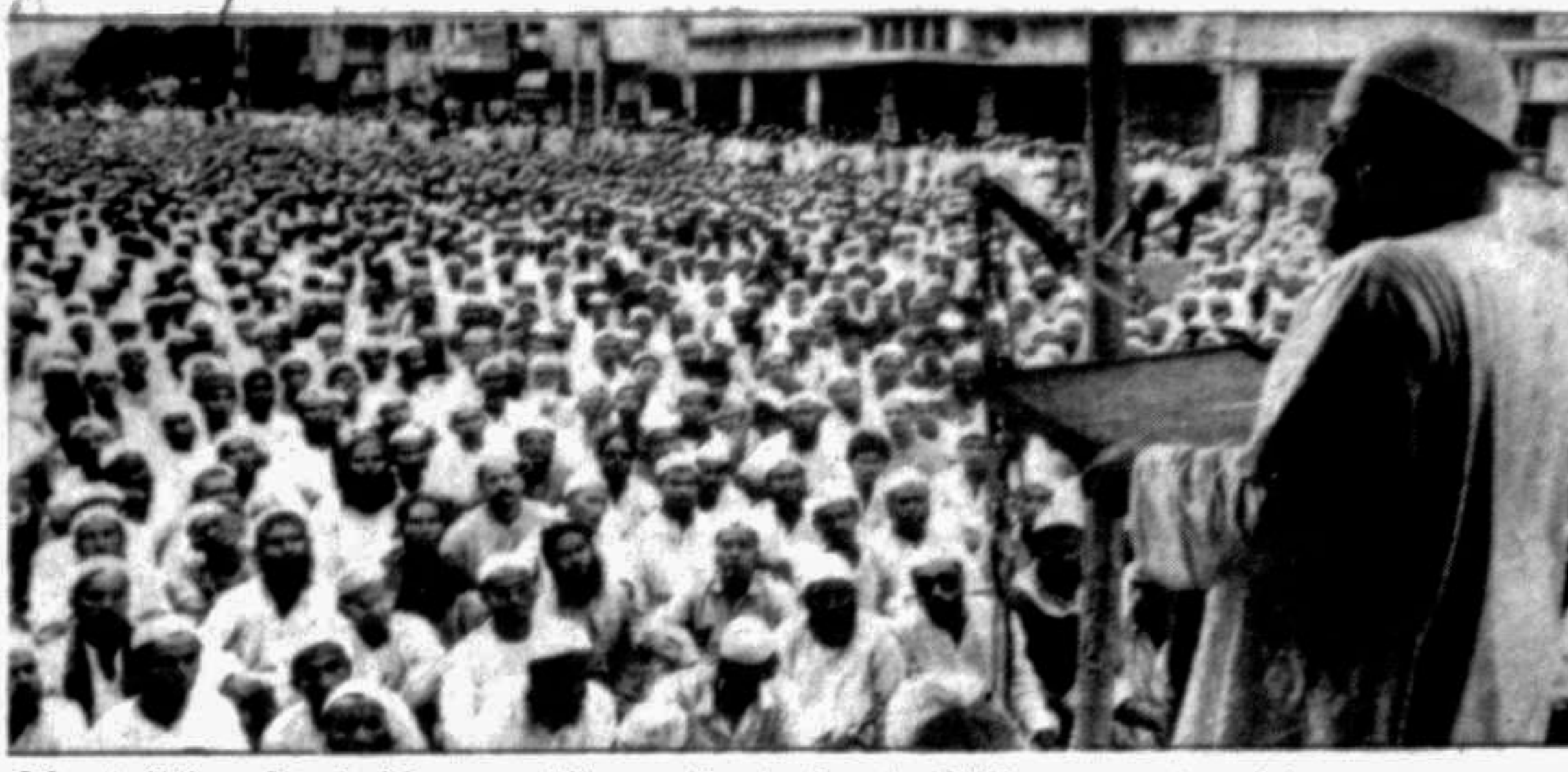
